34,000 DRAFTTEES WILL BE DEFERRED.

SALEM—Preliminary checks by Oregon's draft boards indicated Tuesday that approximately 34,000 of the state's 133,000 selective service registrants will be deferred by new legislation signed Monday by President Roosevelt. This group will include men 28 years or older and others deferred classifications. Colonel Elmer V. Wootton, state selective service director, said that deferrals possible under the new draft laws might increase to 50 per cent.
