ALDER SAWDUST VALUED FOR GARDEN MULCHING

The use of alder sawdust as a substitute for peat moss in retaining moisture in garden and lawn soils has been practiced for several years on a small scale by some nurserymen and gardeners. George Otten, landscape engineer with the State Highway department, has done considerable experimental work along these lines and is quite enthusiastic about the possibilities of this practice. In addition the State Forestry department is carrying on an experiment to determine the effectiveness of the sawdust in mulching seed beds at the nursery.
