Lions Win Second League Tilt From Reedsport 14 to 0

The Cottage Grove Lions won their second Tri-County league game 14-0 from the Reedsport aggregation Saturday at Reedsport. With the rain coming down in bucketsful neither team was able to score in the first quarter. The game saw-sawed back and forth until the middle of the second quarter, when the Lions drove to the Braves' 36-yard line, with two line plunges, gaining nothing. Lusk fired a pass to Minor on the 25-yard line, where he side-stepped two Reedsport men and went over standing up. Lusk bucked center for the extra point, making the score 7-0. The Lions drove again in the second quarter to the 4-yard line where the attack bogged down, as the half ended. Late in the third quarter the Lions started rolling again. After a beautiful run-back of a punt by Bauder, a penalty and another long run by Bauder on a quarterback sneak, found the ball on the Braves' 21-yard line, a reverse from Lusk to Minor completely fooled the Reedsport defense, and Minor again went over standing up. Minor cut off tackle for the extra point, making the final score 14-0.

Reedsport never seriously threatened the Lions' goal.

BUILDING MAY BE CUT.

WASHINGTON—Non-defense construction in the United States will have to be cut about 60 per cent next year because critical materials must be allocated for military and naval needs, experts of the Office of Production Management declared today.

They issued this forecast on civil building prospects quickly after the supply priorities and allocation board had prohibited the use of such vital materials as steel, copper, bronze, brass and aluminum on construction projects not deemed necessary to national defense or to public health and safety.

Remodeling Building At Champion Mine

The old mill building at the Champion mine is being remodeled by the H. & H. Mines to accommodate equipment for a late type ball mill. Most of the equipment is on the ground ready to be set or has been set in the building. Remodeling work has been underway for some time. Construction of a new power house has been completed and diesel engines and generators set for operation.

Exploration is being continued in both the Champion mine and the Musick mine, with workmen tunneling the 800 foot level in the Champion mine. Eighty men are employed in the mines at the present time, it was understood yesterday. The ore taken from the tunnels is being piled up awaiting the start of the mill.

Coastal Streams Still Open to Trout Fishing

Although the general trout season closed on October 15, anglers may fish for trout ten inches or over in coastal streams. From now until December 31, 1941, the daily bag limit for trout in tidalwater will be fifteen fish or fifteen pounds. After January 1, 1942, the bag limit on trout 10 inches or over will be three fish a day.

Above tidalwater, the bag limit for trout 10 inches or over will be three trout a day. This limit is provided in order that fishermen angling for steelhead or salmon will be protected if they should accidentally land a trout above tidalwater.

Steelhead and salmon, fifteen inches or over, may be taken at all times of the year, below or above tidalwater.

These regulations, of course, do not apply to any stream that is closed entirely to fishing.
