Farm Bureau to Hold Convention November 14, 15

PENDLETON—Oregon farm problems in the light of the present national and world situation will occupy the attention of the Oregon Farm Bureau at its seventh annual convention at the Columbia Gorge hotel near Hood River, November 14 and 15, announces Mae Hoke, state president.

The convention proper will open Friday noon, November 14, with the annual address of President Hoke, although this will be preceded by meetings of several committees, which will outline a proposed program of work for 1942. These committees will deal with federal agricultural programs, taxation and legislation, organization and membership, and with the various phases of farm production such as livestock, poultry, dairying, and fruit and vegetable raising.

Speakers on the opening day program will include E. B. McNaughton, president of the First National bank of Portland, who will discuss "What of the Future?" W. L. Teutsch, assistant extension director at Oregon State college, who will speak on "Farmers and the Defense Program;" and G. R. Hyslop, head of the division of plant industries at O. S. C., who will discuss "Making the Farmer Self-Sufficient."

Others on the convention program will be H. W. Young, manager of Oregon Business and Tax Research, Inc.; R. D. Flaherty, secretary of the Washington Farm Bureau; George Hudson, manager of the Wenatchee Apple Growers association, and John Klas, newly

elected secretary of the Oregon Farm Bureau, who is at present organization director of the Wisconsin Farm Bureau. The annual banquet will be held Friday evening, with S. G. Rubinow, Denver, western regional director of the American Farm Bureau federation, the principal speaker.

One feature of the meeting will be joint consideration of wheat growers' and livestock men's problems, with respect to the present wheat marketing quotas. A committee to consider this situation will be headed by F. A. Phillips of Baker.

GLASS EYES.
