Christmas Seal Campaign Explained Chamber Commerce

The Christmas seal campaign was explained at the Chamber of Commerce meeting Tuesday by two guest speakers, C. E. Umphrey, local chairman, and William Van Loan of Eugene, county chairman.

Local features of the annual campaign, details of which will be found elsewhere in this issue, was explained by C. E. Umphrey, who told Chamber of Commerce members that seventy-five percent of the funds secured in the county remain in the county to provide medical care for those unable to consult a physician in prenatal and infant care and in having the necessary medical examinations, x-ray pictures, etc. While Cottage Grove has responded in previous campaigns, more funds have been spent here than has been taken in during the campaigns.

Mr. Van Loan told of the county setup and how the county health association functioned. Last year he said the campaign in the county netted \$4,952.25, supplemented by county, city and federal funds to carry on the work. The campaign originally inaugurated to stamp out tuberculosis has been broadened to include many contagious diseases and the rehabilitation of tuberculosis cases.

Don Drenner, son of Mr. and Mrs. R. S. Drenner of Culp Creek, now stationed near Hampshire, England, says conditions are not bad there. Mr. Drenner, a radio technician, has been stationed at Hampshire in a radio school, learning the ways the English operate radio stations says there is no apparent shortage of anything except clothing and toilet articles. Everything is cheaper than in the States and it's hard to understand why there should be a shortage here or higher prices, he says.

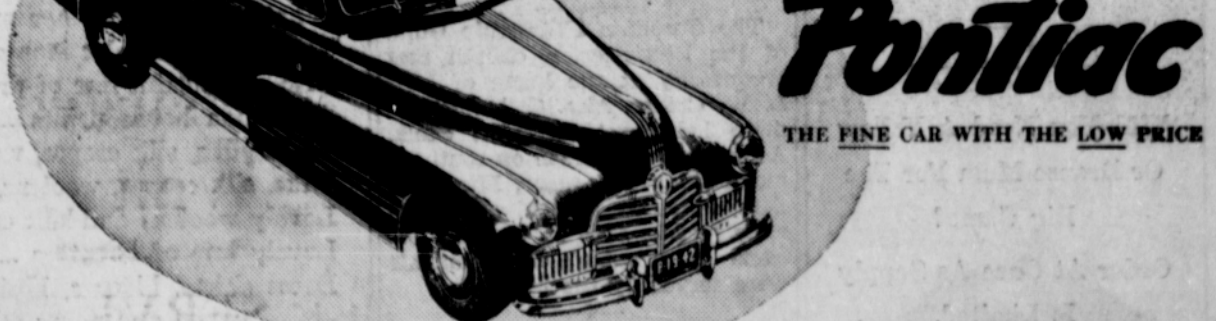

Famous Violinist To Appear Monday McArthur Court

EUGENE, Nov. 25 (Special)—Yehudi Menuhin, world famous master of the violin, will appear in concert here at McArthur court on Monday, December 1, as the second attraction on the University of Oregon's 1941-42 "Greater Artist" series.

Menuhin's campus appearance will be his first in Oregon outside of Portland and University officials expect it to be one of the season's musical highlights.

Thirteen years have passed since the name of Menuhin flashed through the musical world following his memorable debut in New York's Carnegie Hall as a boy of ten. He was then acclaimed as the "wonder child of the violin."

Yehudi is now twenty-three and it will be a handsome young man in white tie and tails who plays in McArthur court. For his concert Menuhin will play his famous "Khevenhuller Stradivarius," valued at \$75,000 and played by only four people since it was made 300 years ago.

Tickets for the concert were placed on sale November 19 at the A.S.U.O. ticket office in McArthur court.

12 Oregonians Are Promoted in Navy

According to word received by Lieutenant G. F. DeGrave, local Navy Recruiting Officer, Tony G. Ketcham of Cottage Grove was among the 12 Oregonians promoted through regulations for the administration of the Navy's temporary promotion act, which was approved July 24. Mr. Ketcham was promoted from chief gunner's mate to gunner.

The men were selected by a board of seven officers who appointed 231 warrant and commissioned warrant officers to a temporary commission status, from among 1,427 who had been recommended by their commanding officers, and chose 1,451 from a list of 11,098 enlisted men for temporary advancement to warrants. Similar boards will be convened from time to time as need arises for further advancements.

Those selected for temporary commissions are being appointed immediately, while those advancing to warrant standing will be appointed in monthly quotas so that the list will be completed in June, 1942.

New Telephone Books To Be Ready Soon

The new telephone directory for Eugene and nearby telephone exchanges, which includes Cottage Grove will be mailed to subscribers the next few days, according to Armorer Miller, acting manager-chief operator of the Pacific Telephone and Telegraph company here.

All numbers at Springfield, Marcola and Junction City have been changed within the year. Throughout the book several hundred other numbers have been changed and the directory will contain 1100 new subscriber names. Mrs. Miller said, adding that customers should discard their old directories with the incorrect numbers.

Other exchanges in the Eugene Area to be found in the directory besides Cottage Grove include Creswell, Florence, Harrisburg, Oakridge and Blachly.
