## Xmas Seal Sale Returns now \$375

Chairman C. E. Umphrey reports the Christmas seal returns are now likely to reach a total figure above \$400 by Christmas time as each mail has quota of cash returns and no mail, as yet, has failed to bring one or more envelopes with cash. This is all the more encouraging as there has been no personal solicitation and each recipient of the seals has made his or her decision without pressure from anyone.

The Lane County Health association, which disburse the funds from the Christmas Seal sale, the smaller proportion going to the National Tuberculosis association, and the balance used directly in Lane county, is officered by voluntary action of citizens over the county and without pay. The nurses and executive secretary are on full time pay, one of the nurses and office being maintained in Cottage Grove above John's Cafe. From this local office a check-up of the health of the youth of this community is made through the schools, through the recommendation of local physicians, and for anyone calling directly at the office who may need advice. The local school districts pay for the actual time of the nurse spent in the school system.

By maintaining a minimum of two nurses full time and one executive secretary, the Federal Government furnishes the salary to the association for one full-time sanitary engineer in Lane county. All other time of the nurse and office is paid through the sale of the Christmas seals annually.
