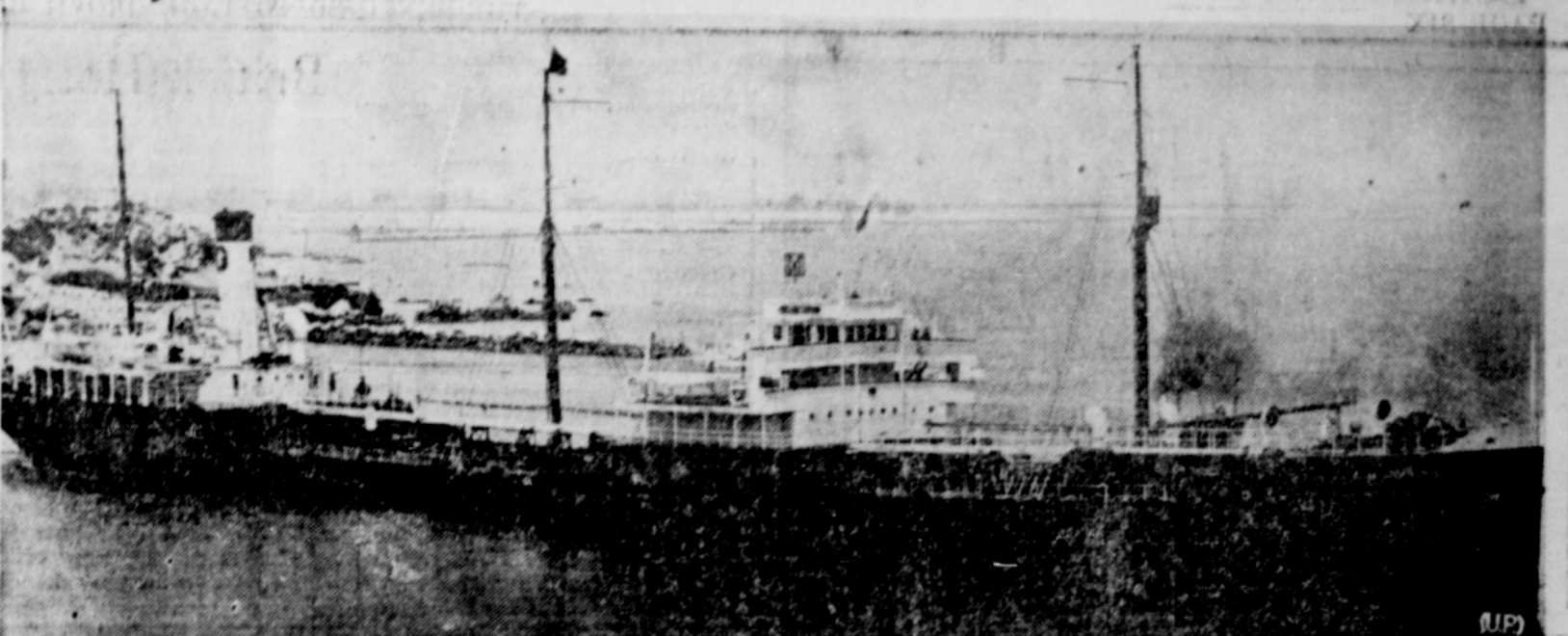

U. S. Navy Experts Study Two-Man 'Sneak Sub' of Japs



Hauled ashore, this two-man "sneak sub" is under study by U. S. Navy experts in Hawaii, where several subs of this type were used in attack on Pearl Harbor. This one was knocked out by shell through conning tower. It is believed to have range of only 200 miles and operates from mother ship. It packs two torpedoes and 300-pound demolition charge touched off by crew in suicide blast. (Passed by U. S. censor.)
