Timely Recipes

Cream of Corn Soup.

1 No 2 can corn
1 quart milk
2 tbsp flour
2 tbsp butter
1/2 tsp salt, dash of pepper
1 slice onion
Cook the corn with the milk and onion in a double boiler for 30 minutes. Remove onion. Put the corn through a strainer, forcing as much of it through as possible. Melt the butter, add flour, and when smooth stir in hot mixture of milk and corn puree. Cook together slowly for a few minutes, and serve very hot with spoonful of whipped cream if desired.

Irish Cream Soup.

3 potatoes
1 slice onion
3 tbsp butter
2 cups milk
1/2 tsp pepper
1 tsp salt
Cook potatoes with onion until soft. Remove the onion and mash potatoes. Meanwhile melt butter and add flour slowly to make a smooth paste. Gradually add the milk stirring constantly until it is quite thick and smooth. Stir in potatoes gradually. Serve piping hot sprinkled with minced parsley.

CHRISTIAN SCIENCE CHURCHES

BOOKS FOR ARMED FORCES SOUGHT IN OREGON DRIVE.

The Oregon State college extension service will assist in the nationwide drive to collect books for distribution to army camps, naval bases, and other service centers, announces Miss Izola Jensen, specialist in community social organization. The campaign is being sponsored by the American library association, the American Red Cross, and the United Service organizations.

"It is hoped that from five to 10 million volumes will be obtained to supplement the library services furnished by the government," says Miss Jensen. "The books obtained will be loaned out free on a liberal basis with no hard and fast return dates and no fines in case the service men are unable to return them."

Those in charge of the campaign stress the fact that the interests of service men cover a wide range, including technical and professional material, as well as recreational reading. The median educational level of the army is third year high school, although many camps, such as those training aviators, are composed almost entirely of college men.

Those who have books to contribute are asked to take them to the nearest public library or school library, where volunteers will collect them for redistribution direct to the nearest military base or service club.

ONLY MILITARY ROADS.

No new contracts will be let by the Oregon State Highway Commission except for roads approved by the army, the commission decided Monday at Portland. Some projects already contracted for will continue.

The ban on new roads, decreed for three months, probably will be renewed and continue as long as conditions remain serious, Chairman Henry F. Cabell forecast.
