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## FIRE IS SABOTAGE

"Today fire is sabotage," says a release from the National Board of Fire Underwriters. "Every fire that destroys a single item of war machinery makes it that much easier for the enemies of freedom to kill and maim the fighting men of our country and of all the United Nations. Every fire that keeps a skilled worker away from his job is a victory for the enemy in his race against time. This war will be won by production and not by ashes."

The war has created many grave new fire dangers. Due to lack of new equipment, it is often necessary to use old and faulty equipment of various kinds in both home and industry. Millions of people are working harder and longer than they ever worked in their lives, and that makes for fatigue and carelessness. It is necessary to put little-trained people to work on factory jobs, and many of these people do not understand the fire hazards which are inherent in their occupations. The tremendous speed-up of industrial output in all fields is in itself a definite but unavoidable fire hazard.

Under these conditions, it is necessary that every conceivable safeguard against fire be used to capacity. Every town and city should at once pass an up-to-date fire prevention ordinance, and enforce it to the letter. Every home-owner should get into the habit of periodically inspecting his home for dangers. And in every factory, workers and managers alike must be trained in fire prevention and control. It is especially important that approved types of fire extinguishers be placed at handy spots in plants—and that all workers be instructed in their operation.

It should be remembered that cleanliness and orderliness are in themselves good defenses against fire. The littered home or shop is all set for a destructive blaze. There's a job for everyone in this fight against fire—and the time to do that job is right now!

## THREE CENTS AND LIBERTY

You lay down two or three cents for your home town newspaper as a matter of habit, expecting it to bring you the latest information from all over the world and never give a thought to how important this press is to you or your family. You never stop to think how much liberty and happiness is bound up in the fact that you can read this kind of a newspaper; you never stop to realize that today only in the United States and some parts of the British empire can men and women read the news of their neighbors and of the world without the blighting touch of governmental control.

Should you be denied that right you would soon realize that more and worse would be coming. You would know that soon your spare time would not be your own, that at any time you could be called out to a party meeting or to a parade before the local or national ruler, with terrific penalties imposed if you failed to obey that summons. You would know that you could no longer swap ideas with your neighbor without letting yourself in for trouble with the secret police. You would know that you could no longer go to your own church or send your children to your Sunday School. You would know that you would soon have no individual rights at all—you would be but the slave of a dictatorial state.

We may perhaps realize these things vaguely but few of us ever stop to think that the newspaper we take so much for granted is the keystone of the liberties of all individuals. Once this free press of ours is muzzled it will be the signal for the suppression and persecution of religion, of the right to belong to a labor union, of the right to speak our minds.

Where the press is free it can function as a protector of the rights of our people and of our free democratic institutions. Where the press is enslaved, these rights of the individual and the free democratic institutions which Americans hold so dear, soon disappear.

## WHAT PRICE PEACE

Those of us who have anything to do with writing and printing words have a tremendous responsibility today.

Speaking before the annual conference of the American Library Association, Edgar Ansel Mowrer, foreign correspondent, now with the office of facts and figures, made the following dramatic statement: "Whether we get a foolish peace or a peace of discernment will result very largely from the kind of books our people read between now and the day the peace congress gets going."

And with books should be included newspaper editorials, magazine articles, and advertisements.

Our people must be sold on the idea that we cannot win the war and then leave Europe and Asia to settle the peace. We cannot drop out of the picture and wash our hands of the whole thing as soon as victory is won, as we did after the last war. If we fail to carry through again, then we can expect a third and greater World War.

The time has come for a world vision, a world plan. Our world has shrunk in size so that from the standpoint of transportation and communication it is no larger than the thirteen original colonies . . . in many ways it is much smaller. We must think big. We must make broad plans. We must create new mental frontiers. Those of us who write must strive to inspire a lasting peace. And success will depend not only on the great epics, but also on the millions of humble, quiet, every-day messages that roll from our printing presses.

As war goes on, industry must "patch and pray." Salvage may be our salvation.

## U. S. POPULATION UPPED TO NEARLY 131 MILLION

The war was given major credit by the census bureau Tuesday for a population increase of 1,327,000 in 1941, boosting the nation's estimated population on January 1 to 133,965,000.

The 1941 increase, double the average for the previous ten years, was ascribed by the bureau largely to business prosperity due to war production, anticipation of being drafted, and the return of Americans from other lands because of the war.

Births in 1941 rose to 2,728,000, about 408,000 more than the 10-year average. Deaths during the year totaled 1,442,000 about average.
