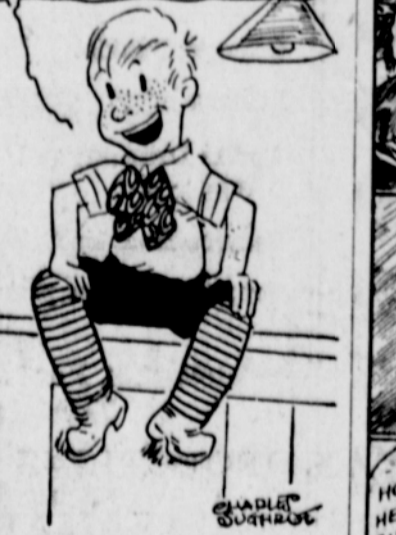

ASKS ISSUANCE OF HISTORIC STAMP

Congressman Homer D. Angell has introduced house joint resolution No. 26 in the house of representatives at Washington, authorizing the issuance of a special postage stamp in honor of the one-hundredth anniversary of the founding of the provisional government at Champog on May 2, 1843, and the coming of the historic covered wagon trail of the same year, which made of the United States a two-ocean country. The resolution authorizes the Postmaster General to issue a stamp of such denomination and design as he may determine. The resolution also authorizes the appropriation of such sum as is necessary to carry out the provisions of the act. A similar resolution was introduced by Congressman Walter Pierce before his retirement from Congress, but that body adjourned before the resolution was acted upon.

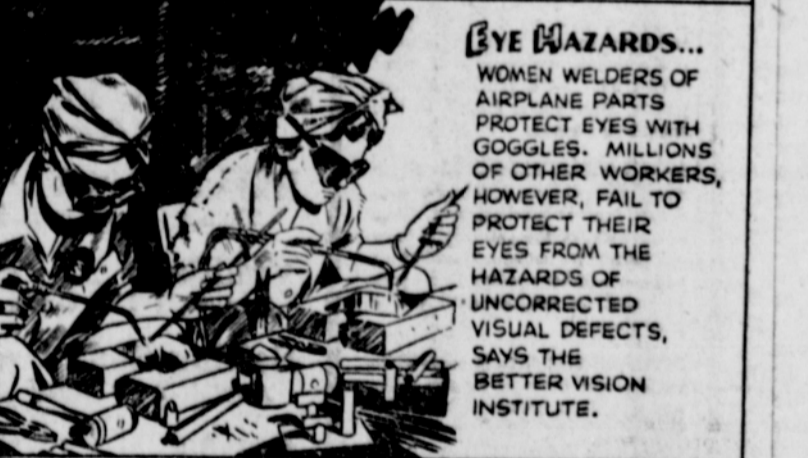
