Coupon No. 13 good for 5 lbs. through August 15. Coupons No. 15 and 16 are good for 5 lbs. each for home canning purposes. Housewives may apply to their local boards for additional rations if necessary.

COFFEE:

Stamp No. 24 (1 lb.) is good through June 30.

SHOES:

No. 17 stamp in war ration book one good for one pair through June 15. Stamp No. 18 (1 pair) will become valid June 16.

MEATS, ETC.:

Red stamps J, K, L good thru June 30.

PROCESSED FOODS:

Blue stamps K, L, M continue good through July 7.
