SOFT CHEESE TYPES ARE TO BE RATIONED

To conserve supplies of milk, rationing will be extended to include all cheeses and cheese products, except cottage, bakers', and pot cheese, the War Food Administration and OPA have announced. All hard cheeses and most cheese foods have been rationed since March 29. Early in June soft perishable cheeses such as cream cheese, Neufchatel, Camembert, Liederkranz, Brick, and blue cheese are to be added to the ration list.
