NOTICE OF SCHOOL ELECTION UPON QUESTION OF INCREASING TAX LEVY OVER AMOUNT LIMITED BY SECTION 11, ARTICLE XI, STATE CONSTITUTION.

Notice is hereby given that an election will be held in School District No. 45 of Lane County, State of Oregon at auditorium of Jefferson building, polls to be open from two o'clock P. M. to seven o'clock P. M. on Thursday July 1, 1943 in said school district, for the purpose of submitting to the legal voters of said district the question of increasing the tax levy for the year beginning July 1, 1943, and ending June 30, 1944, over the amount limited by section 11, Article XI of the Constitution of Oregon.

The reasons for increasing such levy are: The levy within the constitutional limitation is based on the highest levy within the last three years, plus, 6%, this amount being \$8,005.65, which amount is not sufficient to pay the costs of operation of the school as provided for in the budget of the district from July 1, 1943 to June 30, 1944. The amount in excess of the 6% limitation, proposed to be levied for said year is \$8,908.35.
