PROCLAMATION

WHEREAS, the unregulated use of certain forest areas is, in my judgment, a menace to life and property on account of an excessive amount of inflammable debris on the ground, and

WHEREAS, upon the showing of the State Forester, it appears to me to be necessary to close to unregulated use the following areas within and adjacent to the Umpqua National Forest, designated as:

AREA NO. 67P—STEAMBOAT AREA

An area in the North Umpqua River and Row River Drainages the boundary of which is described as follows: Beginning at the north side of North Umpqua Road on the line between Ranges 1 and 2W, thence north on range line approximately 4 miles to the northwest corner of Section 31, T. 25 S., R. 1 W., thence on section lines east to the northwest corner of Section 34, T. 25 S., R. 1 W., north 5 miles, west 1 mile, north 4 miles, west 1 mile, north 1 mile, west to the line between Ranges 1 and 2W, north 3 miles, east to the southwest corner of Section 21, T. 23 S., R. 1 W., north 1 mile, east 1 mile, north 1 mile, east 1 mile, north 4 miles, east 1 mile, and north 10 1/2 miles to the national forest boundary on the Row River-Willamette Divide, thence southeasterly along forest boundary to Windago Pass, thence southwesterly along north side of Cascade Lakes Highway to North Umpqua River, thence down the north bank of said river to Lemolo Falls, thence southerly along west side of Lemolo Falls Trail and Road to Thorn Prairie Road, thence southeasterly along south side of Thorn Prairie Road to Cascade Lakes Highway, thence southerly along west side of said highway to North Umpqua Road, thence westerly along north side of said road to Clearwater Creek, thence down the north banks of Clearwater Creek and North Umpqua River to the line between Sections 22 and 23, T. 26 S., R. 2 E., thence north to the northwest corner of Section 14, said township and range, thence west 2 miles and south on section lines to North Umpqua Road, thence westerly along north side of said road to the point of beginning; excepting, however, S 1/2 Section 30 and N 1/2 Section 31, T. 21 S., R. 1 E., the Brice Creek Road to Fairview Mountain, and the Steamboat Road to Steamboat CCC Camp.

Permits for entering the above-described areas may be obtained at Layng Creek, Big Camas, and Glide Ranger Stations, Sharps Creek and Steamboat Guard Stations, Fairview Lookout Station, and at the junction of North Umpqua Road and Cascade Lakes Highway.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, EARL SNELL, Governor of the State of Oregon, by virtue of the authority vested in me under the provisions of Section 107-209, Oregon Compiled Laws Annotated, do hereby proclaim the unregulated use of the above-described areas to be unlawful and that said areas shall be subject to entry only through permit to be issued by the State Forester or a fire warden, under which permit entrant shall comply with any and all of the following requirements:

- To build no fires except in places designated as safe in said permit.
- To have as a part of his or her equipment, tools suitable for extinguishing fire.
- To refrain from smoking except in places designated as safe in said permit.

This proclamation shall be effective from and after the 12th day of July, 1943, and shall remain in full force and effect until the 31st day of December, 1943.
