RAINS LIGHT SNOW

The new year was appropriately ushered in by rains, the best in the past 30 days, and a light snow. The rainfall Saturday was accompanied by a rather severe wind and Saturday night the first snow extending down into the foothills fell. The snow, however, was soon melted. The precipitation up to Sunday for the duration of the storm measured 1.32 inches at Blackbutte, .72 inch at London and .86 inch at the Cottage Grove dam.
