ARTHRITIS

By Dr. H. A. Hagen
Often I am asked: what is good
for arthritis? The name arthritis
really means joint inflammation.
Of these inflammations there is
a variety, hypertrophic, apophic,
degenerative, proliferative, trau-
matic etc., etc. All of these names
only describe conditions at the
point of inflammation. They tell
nothing about the cause.

Inflammations are processes
which the body utilizes to elimi-
nate something it doesn't want. It
makes little difference whether
the condition to be eliminated is
a splinter in the finger, bran or
grape seed impactions around or
in the appendix or the fluid in an
injured joint in traumatic arthri-
tis.

Often one finds several of these,
in the same patient, so the type
means nothing. What we must
find out is what the body is try-
ing to eliminate. It isn't enough to
say "poisons" for that is self-
evident. One must determine the
kind and cause of the poison,
just as one must use different
methods to save the life of a per-
son who has swallowed lye, and
of a person who inhaled gas from
the kitchen stove. So one must use
different methods to help a person
whose arthritis is due to a strep-
toccocic blood stream infection,
than one whose arthritis may be
due to fallen arches or still an-
other who has arthritis because
of premature cessation of men-
strual flow or maybe just plain
bowels sluggishness and pockets.

The Methods

About nine years ago I was called
in on a case suffering from ar-
thritis of the spine and pleurisy.
She had been in bed 6 weeks,
having been ordered to bed by
her physician for one year. The
examination had to be thorough.
It disclosed ulcers in the small
bowels which were polluting all
her food with pus, a low grade
chronic infection of the caecum
and appendix, catarrh of the liver
and gall bladder and an inflama-
tion of the pleura which was
heading for tuberculosis, with a
temperature hovering around 100.

Here was a typical case of defi-
ciencies, waste retention and in-
fection. She was so emaciated
that a fast or near fast was al-
most prohibitive, but with diet,
hydrotherapy, short-wave, adjust-
ments, colon irrigations, Baun-
scheidt oil treatments and exer-
cises, she was out playing tourna-
ment golf in six months.

So the answer to the question:
"What shall I do for Arthritis?"
is: "Correct the underlying causes,
but first—find them!"
