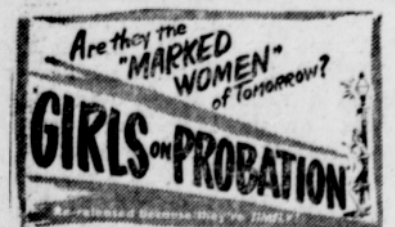

Little Comment on
Coming Primary

There has been little comment to indicate whether the primary Friday will draw a representative vote. Politics has not been able to share a great deal of interest with the war consequently an upset could easily happen.

Interest in this section is centered only on a few contests and of major interest is the race between Ex-Governor Sprague and Senator Guy Cordon for the short term U. S. Senate on the republican ticket. Cordon has apparently gained strength enough to have the edge over Sprague in the state and is expected to poll a heavy vote here. On the republican ticket for the long term senate seat, Wayne Morse looks like a winner over the senate incumbent, Rufus Holman, although those that know Holman say don't count him out too soon.

On the democratic slate, Edgar M. Smith who is expected to outdistance his opponent Walter Whitebeck for the United States senate will get a big vote here.

Two of the liveliest contests among republican candidates for county offices will be a big drawing card in getting out the vote and the warmest of these is the county judges race between the present judge, Clinton Hurd and Fred Knox possessing a slight advantage as this is written. In the three cornered county coroner's race the vote will be close with Poole, incumbent who has heretofore pulled out by a good majority. Claude Gray might pull a surprise and merge the winner.

The above does not necessarily mean that we endorse the winners, but is merely a pre election prediction, which might be interesting to keep tab on when the final vote is counted.

Road- Bridge Levy

The proposed two mill road and bridge levy, which would be created as a sort of a post war cushion, likewise has caused little discussion. Among the proposals for south Lane county is a new bridge over Row River to care for a growing lumber industry east of here. According to a letter received by the publisher from Judge Clinton Hurd, property values in this vicinity aggregate approximately \$5,000,000 which would create a yearly revenue of \$8,000 to \$10,000 over the five year period. No estimate is available on the cost of a steel bridge but a wooden bridge would cost in the neighborhood of \$8,000 to \$10,000, whether this would be a treated wood bridge we do not know. Another improvement talked, but not officially approved by the court is the elimination of the curves on the Disston road, particularly around Knox hill.

In the plan approved by the county court also is three miles of oiled road in Delight Valley and reduce the mountain curvature on the Cottage Grove-Lorane road and extend oiling of same, both projects have merit as well as the Row River bridge.

National Forest Timber Sale

Sealed bids will be received by the Forest Supervisor, Roseburg, Oregon, up to and including June 20, 1944, for all the live and dead timber designated for cutting located on an area embracing about 120 acres within the S $\frac{1}{2}$ NW $\frac{1}{4}$ and NE $\frac{1}{4}$ NW $\frac{1}{4}$, Section 28, T. 22 S., R. 1 W., W.M., Sharps Creek watershed, Umpqua National Forest, estimated to be 2,520,000 feet B.M., more or less, of Douglas-fir, 151,000 feet B.M., more or less, of western hemlock, 207,000 feet B.M., more or less, of western redcedar, 36,000 feet B.M., more or less, of California incense-cedar, and an unestimated amount of white fir, sugar pine, and white pine. No bid of less than \$4.35 per M feet for Douglas-fir, sugar pine, and white pine, \$1.60 per M feet for western hemlock and white fir, and \$1.35 per M feet for western redcedar and California incense-cedar will be considered. In addition to the prices bid for the stumpage, a cooperative deposit of \$0.15 per M feet B.M. to cover cost of tree planting, seed sowing and timber stand improvement work on the area cut over for the total cut of timber under the terms of the agreement, will be required. \$4,000 must accompany each bid, to be applied on the purchase price, refunded, or retained in part as liquidated damages, according to conditions of sale. The right to reject any and all bids is reserved. Before bids are submitted, full information concerning the timber, the conditions of sale, and the submission of bids should be obtained from the Forest Supervisor, Roseburg, Oregon, or District Ranger, Disston, Oregon. Before final award, the high bidder will be required to make a satisfactory showing of financial ability to carry out the agreement. Bids with rates in excess of those permissible under MRP 460 will be reduced to the allowable maximum in making the award. 40-21-44.

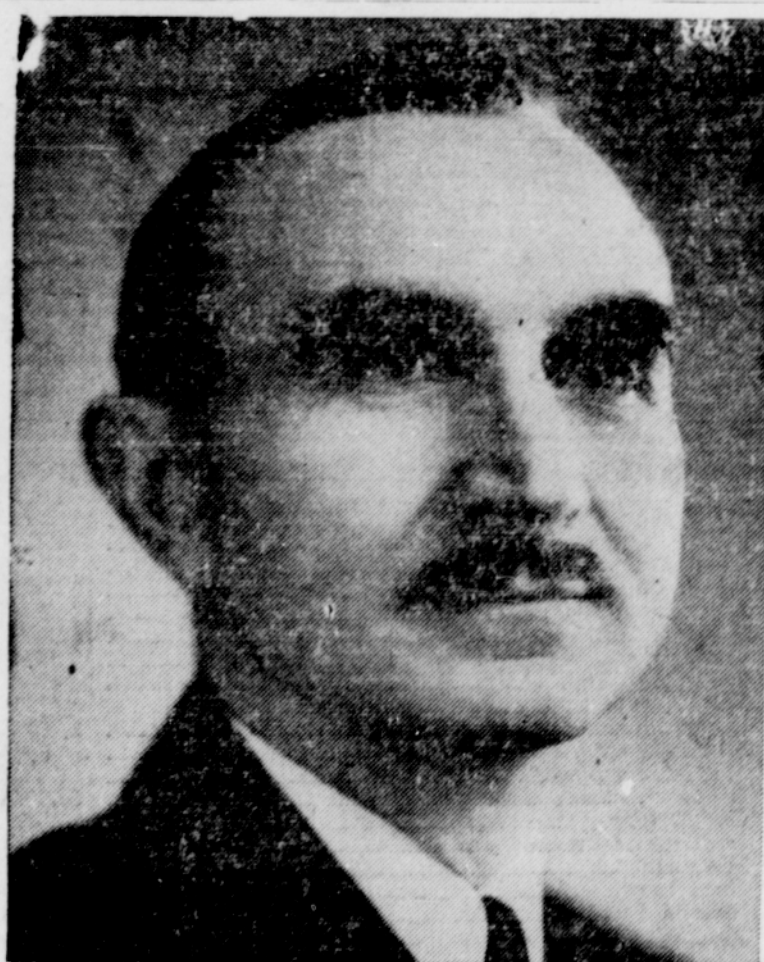

Julia says
Let's enjoy fresh
spring vegetables



NOW THAT fresh vegetables are coming on the market in good quantity again, it's a good time to explore some of the possibilities of using them in fresh and lively ways.

First, though, here are some general suggestions that are worthy of a second glance:

Rinse freshly-bought vegetables in cold water (don't soak them); wrap in damp cloth or replace in paper bag or put in vegetable compartment; and store in refrigerator.

If they must be peeled, don't peel them till the last minute.

Cook them quickly in the least possible amount of water (exceptions are spinach and strong-flavored vegetables like cabbage, which are best cooked in plenty of water, uncovered).

To hold the bright color in red cabbage and beets, add ½ tsp. vinegar or lemon juice for each cup of shredded vegetable, to the boiling water.

STRING beans, with strings removed, will taste better if you slit down the middle or at an angle, before cooking them!

CALICO VEGETABLE HASH
Combine 1 cup each of diced cooked turnips, carrots, beets and potatoes; moisten with 4 tbsps. meat stock or water enriched with a beef cube. Melt 3 tbsps. shortening in hot frying pan; spread the vegetables evenly over the pan's surface and cover. Reduce heat and cook slowly 15 to 20 minutes or until brown crust is formed. Loosen hash from pan, fold in half, turn out on hot platter and serve. Serves 6.

SPINACH PANCAKES
Drain and chop 2 cups cooked spinach very fine and add 1 cup dry bread crumbs, 1 tsp. salt, ½ tsp. pepper and 4 eggs slightly beaten. Drop by tablespoonfuls into a hot greased frying pan and fry until brown, turning once. Serve with highly seasoned tomato sauce. Serves 6.
