Oregon range livestock operators are reminded by the state AAA office that filing of a grazing management plan with their county AAA committee by May 1 is required for participation in the grazing land management practice of the 1944 AAA program.

This practice assists operators of units of more than 640 acres to carry out a conservation program within limits of each operator's manpower and material resources, points out Muri E. Cummings, state range fieldman. Rate of payment is 2 cents an acre for conservation plan, plus the cost of range improvements performed up to 3 cents an acre.

For western Oregon operators, a variation of the practice offers payment of not more than 5 cents an acre for range improvements performed.

Army Transport

A transport overseas the approximately 3,700 vehicles and the equipment of one armored division takes 15 Liberty ships, in addition to troopships. An armored division in action and on the move uses 650 tons of gasoline, 600 tons of ammunition and 35 tons of food a day. A Liberty ship would have to arrive every eight days to maintain it in battle.

Cave Yields Fossils

California's central San Joaquin valley yielded bones of the extinct American camel, bison and horse, with four human skeletons believed to be thousands of years old. Excavations for a war-housing project at Millbrae, Calif., brought to light fossilized bones of mammoths measuring from 10 to 13 feet. The huge animals are supposed to have perished when mired in a bog.

Both Sides Right In Plow Argument Says O. S. C. Leader

The current nationwide argument over plowing, started by publication of the book, "Plowman's Folly", which advocates complete elimination of the moldboard plow, finds both sides right as to principle but neither side always right as to practice, in the opinion of Art King, extension soils specialist at Oregon State college.

"Both sides are right and their points can be proved, both by scientific facts and practical experience," says King. "There may be those who prefer to be right and go broke because of poor yields, but farming can be more pleasant and profitable if based on production instead of principle."

King points out that, while the plowers and non-plowers are right about what happens to the soil under both methods, the latter apparently forget that any wealth created by farming comes from the soil. When nature supported only nature, nothing was removed or sold. A farmer in making a living, on the other hand, sells fertility from the farm in the form of crops. Therefore, while plowing may deplete land, it does so only as an aid to high production.

Plowing, by stopping plant growth and mixing surface organic matter with the soil, does start the destruction of the soil, but such destruction is necessary to make plant food available, both

soil minerals, King explains. There comes a time after continued, intensive plowing when there is no more fuel to burn and the soil may be completely worn out.

Far sighted farmers avert this by planning a farming system for the continued renewal of organic matter, either through rotation with soil building crops or annual addition from cover or green manure crops, or from spreading straw or barnyard manure.

King adds, however, that a number of successful tillage implements are used instead of the moldboard plow, either periodically or under certain soil and cropping conditions, as in trashy fallow farming in eastern Oregon.
