

Dress Added to WAC Uniform

A dress has been added to the authorized uniform of the Womens Army Corps, according to an announcement made by the War Department.

It is to be called the off-duty dress, is designed by the Quartermaster Corps and may be worn in place of the regulation suit uniform during the women soldier's hours of recreation on or off the post or on leave.

The new costume, a soft shirt-maker type one-piece dress, in a flattering creamy shade called Military Beige, with gold accents, was modeled by two proud members of the WAC in twin press conferences, one at the Pentagon in Washington and the other at the Womens Military Services Club in New York.

The dress, in washable crease-resistant rayon shantung, has been authorized for summer wear and will be available before midsummer to the officers and enlisted personnel for purchase at cost from the Quartermaster.

An unique feature of the new dress is that both officers and en-

listed will wear the identical model, with the officer's rank insignia, worn on the buttoned shoulder tabs, as the sole distinguishing feature. Non-commissioned officers will wear their stripes on both sleeves embroidered in beige to match the dress.

Softly tailored, with fly-front closing, casual shirtwaist top and graceful six-gored skirt, the dress has the standard U. S. Army Officer's gold colored buttons, with pierced eagles fastening the flaps of the two shield-shaped breast pockets and the shoulder tabs. The gold accent is repeated on the collar points, where the standard insignia of branch of the Army and the accompanying U. S. are fastened.

Special accessories are authorized for the off-duty dress, including the new WAC garrison cap, especially made in the shantung to match, a simple brown handbag which the WAC may choose for herself, and brown shoes of commercial design with closed toe and heel, the heel of military or Cuban height and regulation cotton chamois-colored gloves.
