PROGRESS WITHOUT COMPULSION

It will be welcome news to hundreds of thousands of fathers and mothers whose sons are in service in tropical countries to read the statement of Rear Admiral Luther Sheldon, Jr., Assistant Chief of the Navy Bureau of Medicine and Surgery, to the effect that "the danger of tropical diseases for our armed forces has been overcome to a large extent." The Navy medical officers feel that they "have the problem licked." Admiral Sheldon said that he was not now at liberty to give details on the conquest of the tropical diseases, but to medical men who have heard his statement on the subject, it meant the equivalent of a major victory on the battlefield. The progress that has been made in medicine, even during the present war, is far beyond the understanding of the average citizen who will reap the benefits. It is the result of the tireless efforts of individual doctors and institutions, free from the hampering influences of a politically-dominated medical profession such as is being proposed now on a national scale. Socialized medicine would subject an estimated 80 per cent of our citizens to ironclad rules and taxes for a compulsory health insurance program.

Compulsion in medicine does not bring progress. Nothing is more personal than the relationship between an individual and his doctor, and nothing should be farther from political domination.

YOU ARE YOUR OWN SANTA CLAUS

According to Business Week, revenues from income and excess-profits taxes will decrease. Profits of large industrial corporations after taxes, as compiled by the federal reserve, hit top in 1941. The over-all return for 1943, on much greater volume, was close to 20 per cent below 1941. There will be no "rich to soak," so more of the money to cover all waste, extravagance, and incursions of government into the field of business will come out of the small taxpayer. Uncle Sam isn't Santa Claus. He is just the tax bill collector from 135,000,000 little Santa Clauses.

gress following the November election.

The reason for this discussion is this: If the election is fairly close and a number of the electors from southern states refuse to cast their ballots for the nominee of either party when the electoral college meets, neither nominee will receive a majority of the electoral votes. Whereupon, according to section I of article II of the constitution, as amended by the 12th amendment which became a part of the constitution December 12, 1803, and by the 20th amendment which became a part of the constitution February 6, 1933, it will be necessary for the House of Representatives to elect a president "... from the persons having the highest number not exceeding three on the list of those voted for as president. . . ." The vice president, under such circumstances, is elected by the senate. The vote in the house of representatives is by states, the representation from each state having but one vote.

If this situation should develop, the congress will have to meet and make its selection on or before January 20, 1945. If, by reason of a deadlock, or for any other reason, the House and senate fail to choose a president and a vice president on or before January 20, another very peculiar situation would apparently exist. The 20th Amendment endeavors to meet the situation by providing that "... the congress may by law provide for the case wherein neither a president-elect nor a vice president-elect shall have qualified, declaring who shall then act as president, or the manner in which one is to act shall be selected, and such person shall act accordingly until a president or vice president shall have qualified".

The strange thing about that provision is that Section 7 of Article I says in part: "Every bill which shall have passed the House of Representatives and the Senate, shall, before it becomes a law, be presented to the President of the United States. . . ."

Apparently, therefore, the Congress cannot, under the Constitution, enact a law to meet the situation after the 20th of January, 1945, for the reason that a bill cannot become a law until it has been submitted to the President, and there would be no President, his term having expired January 20th.

Obviously there is small likelihood of this situation developing, but due to the shortness of time between the convening of Congress on January 3rd and the expiration of the term of the President and vice president on January 20th, it does seem to be a possibility, however remote.

It seems a very definite possibility that, if Mr. Roosevelt is nominated by the Democratic convention in July, and the southern revolt against the New Deal and the Fourth Term continues, the election will be thrown into the Congress.

Red stamps AS through VS good indefinitely.

Blue stamps AS through VS, good indefinitely.

Sugar
Sugar stamps 30 and 31 each are good for five pounds indefinitely. Sugar Stamp 32 becomes good for five pounds, June 16th. Sugar Stamp 40, good for five pounds of canning sugar through February, next year.

Gasoline
A-11 coupons are good through June 21, A12 coupons good June 22 through September 21.

Tire Inspection Deadlines
Regular inspections not required after April 20.

Fuel Oil
Periods 4 and 5 coupons, good through September 30. New period 1 coupons for the 1944-1945 heating year may be used as soon as they are received from local boards.

HOME CANNING SUGAR

Consumers who do not apply for canning sugar during the first period which ends June 15 may obtain their full 20-pound-per-person allowance during the second period starting June 16 if the application justifies that amount. Willard Case district OPA food rationing representative, explained.

Local OPA boards are reported swamped with applications for canning sugar by housewives who believe this is their last chance to get the full allotments, Case said.

Maximum of home canning ration for the season remains unchanged at 25 pounds. Case emphasized, five pounds of which are available by use of sugar stamp 40 from ration book 4.

To the Legionnaire who brings in the largest sale of bonds, a medal and citation will be awarded. The awards will be made at an installation dinner early in the fall.

Items most manufacturers will be able to produce under this relaxation, include corn shellers, feed grinders, pitchforks, hand cultivators, rakes, hoes, shovels and barnyard and poultry equipment.

week closing on Friday June 23rd with an all church picnic. All children are invited to attend.

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
