

War or Not--The Circus Still Showing Achievement Roll For Last 6 Weeks

WHAT ABOUT TONSILS?

"There was a time when removal of tonsils was considered almost a routine necessary early in a child's life. In the last five years," states a medical doctor in

a recent article, "there has been a definite change of medical opinion on this point. Physicians now believe that tonsils should be removed only when a careful study of the individual child indicates the likelihood that that child will derive benefit from such removal."

During the school year, periodic health examinations are given to children, after which many parents are advised to have their child's tonsils removed.

Since the summer is a convenient time to have this done, we bring to your attention the case of a family in Akron, which was recently recorded in TIME magazine. Five children in this family had their tonsils removed, and contracted infantile paralysis within forty-eight hours. A sixth child in the same family did not have the tonsilectomy, and did not suffer the attendant paralysis, although the virus was present. This is told merely to point out that, in this case, investigators cautioned against tonsil operations during the infantile paralysis season, which is the summer and fall.

Tonsils are useful guardians of the throat and also serve to protect the bronchial tubes and lungs, by absorbing infection, and thus protect the body against it. No child should be deprived of this protection if there is any possibility of saving the tonsils without causing other evidences of ill health.

Amphibian Tractors Have Important Role In Pacific Landings

EMIRAU ISLAND. (Delayed)—Marine Corps amphibian tractors which played a key role in the landings here, had earlier proved their worth in the Pacific. They were used to varying extents at Guadalcanal, Tulagi, New Georgia and the Gilberts, and performed so capably on operations that they were assigned to a more important place in the offensive in the Marshalls and on New Britain, as well as Bougainville.

Units which carry crack Leatherneck troops ashore here were tested in battle in the establishment and consolidation of the beachhead on the shore of Empress Augusta Bay, Bougainville, last November and December.

Tractors Carried Supplies
At Bougainville, on terrain that was impassable to other means of transportation, the water-land vehicles carried thousands of tons of supplies and equipment to the front lines. They were also used to evacuate wounded from the front and to carry out reconnaissance and combat missions.

Machine-gun crews aboard the amphibians were credited with shooting down two Jap zeros during the Bougainville campaign. Though the Japs often concentrated air and artillery attacks against the tractors, not a single one was lost because of enemy action at Bougainville.

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GELATIN USED IN PLACE OF STARCH FOR RAYONS

Ordinary household gelatin may be used as "starch" to restore rayon dresses that have become limp and crush easily after washing, reports Miss Lucy Lane, extension specialist in clothing and textiles at Oregon State college. Information on this new way of handling rayon fabrics has been received from the U. S. department of agriculture.

Starch is not used successfully with rayon fabrics but plain granulated gelatin, softened and then dissolved in water, will give somewhat the same body or filling. For most rayon dresses two tablespoons are enough, although more or less may be used, according to the stiffness desired. Less can be used for sheer rayon.

Gelatin is softened first by soaking a few minutes in a little cold water and then dissolved in boiling water. The solution is poured into a container large enough to hold the dress and enough cold water to make it comfortable to the hands. The dress is washed and rinsed and then dipped in the gelatin solution, and then squeezed gently and rolled in a thick bath towel until dry enough to iron.
