PROCLAMATION

WHEREAS, the unregulated use of certain forest areas is, in the judgment of the State Forester, a menace to life and property due to conditions tending to cause or allow the rapid spread of fires which might occur or because of the inaccessible character of such areas due to the lack of suitable roads, and

WHEREAS, upon the showing of the State Forester it appears to me to be necessary to close to unregulated use the following areas designated as:

AREA NO. R-1 - All National Forests in Oregon and adjacent areas protected by the United States Forest Service as follows:

Adjacent to Umpqua National Forest: Sections 30 to 33 inclusive, T. 23 S., R. 1 W.; Sections 1 to 6 inclusive, 8 to 16 inclusive, 21 to 28 inclusive, and 33 to 36 inclusive, T. 24 S., R. 1 W.; Sections 1, 23, 10 to 15 inclusive, 22 to 27 inclusive, and 31 to 36 inclusive, T. 25 S., R. 1 W.; S. 1/2 Sections 23 and 24, Sections 25 to 28 inclusive, and 33 to 36 inclusive, T. 26 S., R. 2 W.; Ts. 30 and 31 S., R. 2 W.; S. 1/2 Section 19, SW. 1/4 Section 20, and Sections 30, 31, and 32, T. 31 S., R. 3 W.; E. 1/2 Sections 25 and 36, T. 31 S., R. 4 W.; Sections 19, 25, 33, 35, and 36, T. 32 S., R. 3 W.; W. 1/2 Section 6, T. 33 S., R. 2 W.; and N. 1/2 and SE. 1/4 Section 1, T. 33 S., R. 3 W.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, EARL SNELL, Governor of the State of Oregon, by virtue of the authority vested in me under the provisions of Section 107-210, Oregon Compiled Laws Annotated, do hereby proclaim the unregulated use of the above-described areas to be unlawful and do hereby close said areas and the same shall be subject to use only upon condition that entrants shall comply with all of the following requirements or conditions:

1. To refrain from smoking while traveling in such areas, except on paved or surfaced highways.

2. To secure a permit issued by the forester or a fire warden before building a campfire other than at improved, designated and posted campgrounds on such areas.

3. To have as a part of his or her equipment when using campfires, except when traveling as a pedestrian, and/or camping at improved, designated and posted campgrounds, tools as specified by the forester suitable for extinguishing fires.

This proclamation shall be effective from and after the 5th day of July, 1944, and shall remain in full force and effect until and including the 31st day of December, 1944.

BULLETIN ON FEED FOR LAYERS REVISED AT OSC

Feed represents the largest item of cost in the business of producing eggs, points out H. E. Cosby, head of the poultry department at Oregon State college, in a late revision of a previous bulletin, "Feeding Laying Hens."

This extension bulletin, No. 633, discusses fundamental factors in feeds for egg production, feeding methods, and handling diets for breeding hens and those laying hens kept in individual cages. Cosby says that mass production practices, increased egg production per hen, year-round confinement of laying stock, and other industry developments have increased feeding problems, but that research has in the main kept pace with these changes.

Flag of the Americas The white flag symbolizing peace was adopted at the Seventh International Conference of the American States at Montevideo in 1933. It bears three purple crosses to signify the three virtues of Columbus. Behind the central cross is a bronze sun of the Incas, commemorating all the native Indian races of the three Americas or the Western hemisphere.

First Sawmill Several companies claim the first sawmill, but the records of the Virginia company indicate that sawmills were established in Jamestown in 1608. Sawmills were also established in New York in 1623. One was at the site of Albany, the present state capital. Another is believed to have been built near York, Maine, the same year.
