MANY STATE ROADS NEED REPAIRS

Many state highways will be in need of repairs and rebuilding by the end of the war, according to an Office of War Information report, based on data from the Public Roads Administration and state and private agencies. At present, the most impressive immediate program calls for improving 34,000 miles of rural and urban highways as recommended by the National Interregional Highway Committee. Final action by Congress is pending.

Yield Well

Tomatoes are an excellent crop for the small garden, as they yield well. To save space, the plants can be set close together and pruned to stakes. Pole beans also will yield more in a small area than bush beans, and they continue to bear until late fall.

Vitamin C in cabbage is easily destroyed by heat and easily oxidized by air. Serve cabbage raw just after slicing, or cook it just long enough to make it tender.

Pacific History

History of Mariana Islands goes back to a voyage made in 1521 by the Portuguese navigator Magellan, then in the service of the king of Spain. Looking for the "Spice Islands" he came upon Guam, saw so many native canoes fitted with pointed mat sails that he named the islands *Islas de las Velas Latinas* (Islands of the Lateen Sails). Thefts charged to natives stirred him to change the name to *Los Ladrones* (The Thieves). In 1669 the group was officially named the Marianas for Maria Anna of Austria, widow of Philip IV of Spain.

Italian Winds

In Italy, spectacular winds play a prominent part. Among them is the fierce bora, coming from across the northern Adriatic, and causing heavy snow in the northern Apennines. The cold and violent mistral sweeps from France's Rhone-valley funnel along the northwest coasts of Italy. The hot, dust-thickened sirocco, from over the deserts of Africa, brings Italy the "blood rains," so-called because of the reddish brown stains they leave.

Unnecessary Burning

Destruction by fire of the stalks and straw from 100 bushels of corn and 30 bushels of soybeans consumes about five tons of organic matter with the loss of as much nitrogen as is contained in more than 100 bushels of corn. Fall and winter burning of these residues leaves the soil unprotected against washing from heavy spring rains.

More Pigs

Alfalfa meal fed to brood sows during gestation at the rate of 12 per cent total ration basis increased the percentage of pigs weaned from 13 to 63 per cent in recent University of Illinois tests. Legume hays and meals are excellent carriers of water-soluble vitamins, filling out the ration formula.

Blackeye Peas

Vary Griddle Cakes

Griddle cakes can be varied by adding fruit like blueberries or finely chopped apples or pineapple to the batter before mixing. Other interesting variations are possible by using different types of flour or cereal meals such as cornmeal, buckwheat flour, soybean flour or whole wheat flour.

Round-Up

Under the "Corn - For War" program, War Food Administrator Marvin Jones said, "Farmers have fought the war as truly as though on the battlefield," by providing almost 68 million bushels of corn for the manufacture of essential war materials. The 63,637 Mexicans now working on farms in 17 Western States represent the largest number employed at any time since the program to use Mexican workers was started in September, 1942. WFA reports.

The first counterfeit among the serially numbered gasoline coupons, a B-3 has been picked up by an OPA investigator in Western Pennsylvania, and OPA has warned the trade to check coupon endorsements against license numbers. Persons who lose their War Ration Books no longer are required to advertise the loss before replacements are made, OPA says.

Department of Agriculture scientists have discovered in bright or blue-cured tobacco a valuable glucoside, rutin, that is effective in treating conditions arising from high blood pressure. Chicks produced by commercial hatcheries during the first six months of 1944 totaled 1,035,471,000 compared to 1,290,316,000 for the same period last year—a decrease of 19.8 percent—USDA reports. Of the approximately 11,355,000 workers on farms in the United States, July 1, those who received wages were paid at the highest rates on record, USDA says.

Celery Tops

Celery tops may be chopped fine and put into a meat or a salmon loaf to give it a piquant flavor. Some cooks like to lay celery leaves on top of a roast while it is cooking. The tops may also be cooked with the stalks for soup. Tops may be kept for later use by washing them thoroughly, then drying and putting them in a paper sack.
