## Captain George Franck Rescued

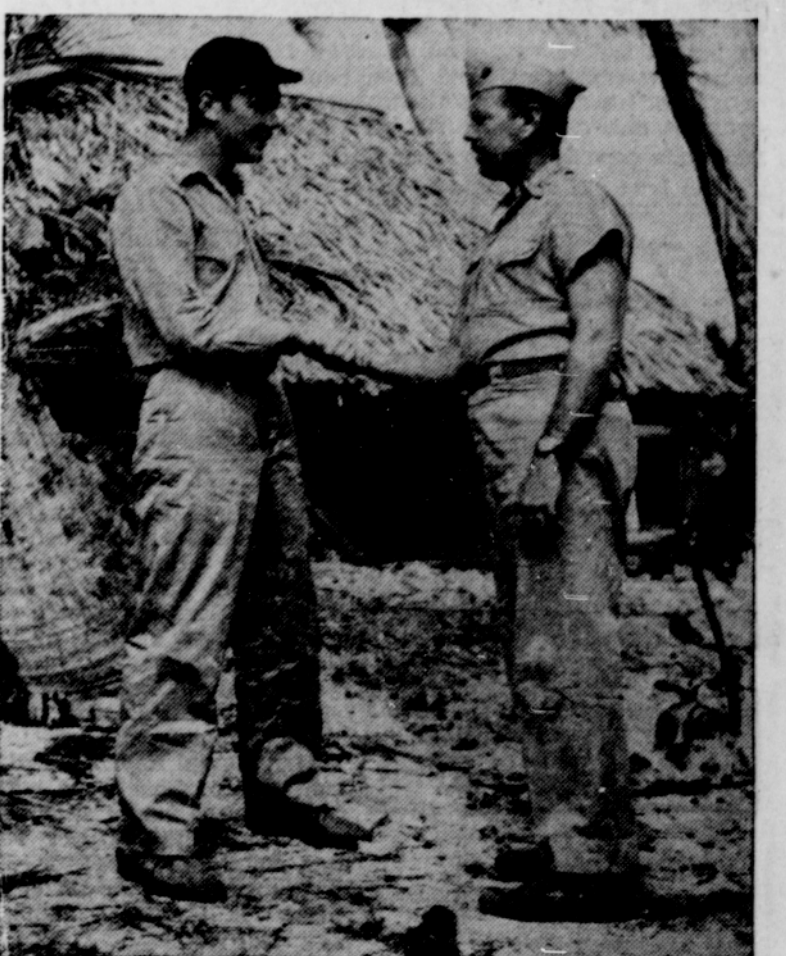
