When Kelly started training for his most recent role, M-G-M's "Thousands Cheer," a gay Technicolor musical coming to the Arcade Theatre September 24, 25 and 26th, featuring Kathryn Grayson, Mary Astor and John Boles in addition to Kelly, he became convinced that outside of rhyme, the words "ease" and "trapeze" have nothing in common.

Out on the studio back lot, hoists rings and a healthy supply of mattresses were rigged together to supply a safe and sane rehearsal ground. Kelly's maneuvers started at some fifteen feet from the ground. As his skill and courage increased, so did the height of the aerial swings. By the time the number was actually filmed, Kelly and his flying partners, Frances Rafferty and Mary Elliott were doing their stuff thirty feet above the ground, with only the mesh of a legally required life-net visible between.

Studio Engages Experts
As coaches for the screen troupe, the studio engaged the services of an aerial act known as the Flying Wards. The Flying Wards have appeared with every major circus in the country and are up on all the latest aerial tricks.

On one occasion Kelly gave the grounded cast and crew of the film a genuine, if not in the script, thrill.

"For the first time I was really enjoying myself," he recounted, "there was a certain freedom to swinging back and forth so high in the air. Suddenly I realized it was my cue to swing from the trapeze to the landing platform that measured slightly less than two feet square."

YOUR CHANCES OF GETTING SICK

You, as an average citizen, will have an illness this year which will keep you out of work for 10 days. During the days you are incapacitated, you will be merely one of the 6,000,000 persons in this country who are also too sick to work, to go to school, to carry on normal activities, or to stay at their victory jobs. The total number of disabling illnesses for the whole country will be 22,000,000. Illnesses lasting less than a week are not counted in this figure; the average duration of those that are included is 57 days.

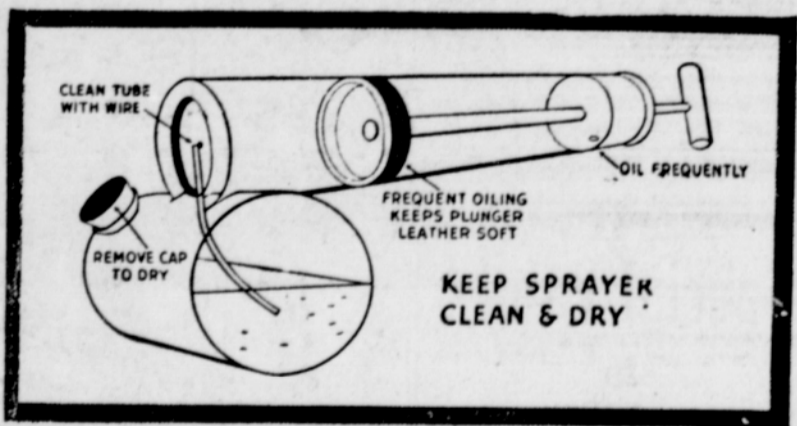
Your age will affect your probability of falling sick. If you are over 65, you have one chance in eight of being ill on any given day. If you are between 15 and 24, your chances of illness are only one in forty. If you are a child, or adult between 25 and 65 years of age, your likelihood of being sick at any given time is one in twenty-two—one sick person to twenty-one well ones.

The older you are, the longer the time your "average" illness per year will disable you. If you are over 65, your average time out for illness during the year will be five weeks. Between 15 and 64 you can expect to lose an average of nine days a year. This drops to a little less than a week per year if you are under 15.

These statistics were collected in a national health survey made by the United States Public Health Service.

Brush Overcoats

Overcoats and other articles that cannot be washed should be brushed thoroughly, paying particular attention to folds and seams where dust and lint accumulate. Place the articles on hangers and put them on the line to air for several hours before giving them moth-preventive treatment and storing them.
