Housing Shortage Relief Possible

Relief from the present housing shortage in the Cottage Grove area has just been made possible. George W. Copen regional representative of the National Housing Agency, announced today that this locality has been determined eligible for an unlimited number of residential conversion priorities. This action is in accordance with the recent announcement of the War Production Board and the National Housing Agency that such priorities would be made available in areas where NHA determines that housing shortages are causing extreme hardship.

Apartment houses and other existing dwelling units may now be remodeled or converted to provide smaller housing units. Applications for permission to convert or remodel such structures should be filed with the Federal Housing Administration, a constituent unit of NHA, at 515 Platt Building Portland 5, Oregon. The applicant will be permitted use of materials contained in the War Housing Critical List and the rents charged will be under OPA regulations. Occupancy will not be limited to war workers.

Need for providing additional living units for general occupancy in congested areas has long been recognized but little could be done about it until materials needed to construct housing for war workers could be released.

FURLOUGH RATIONS INCREASED

Inasmuch as processed foods are now valued only in multiples of 10 ration points, the rations of these foods are for service men on leave or furlough for 72 hours or more have been increased from eight to 10 points for each nine meals. OPA announces, Civilians eligible for temporary food rations will be issued processed food rations on the basis of 10 points for each seven days.

OREGON'S DIVORCE RATE DOUBLES IN TEN YEARS

Salem.—Oregon's divorce rate has doubled in the past 10 years, State Treasurer Scott said Monday.

There were 8215 divorces filed in the state in the year ended last June 30, compared with 6344 in the preceding year, 4119 in 1940, and 3470 in 1935.

The state treasurer obtains the statewide divorce information from payments made by counties, each county having to pay the state \$5 for each divorce filed.
