"A JUST AND LASTING PEACE"

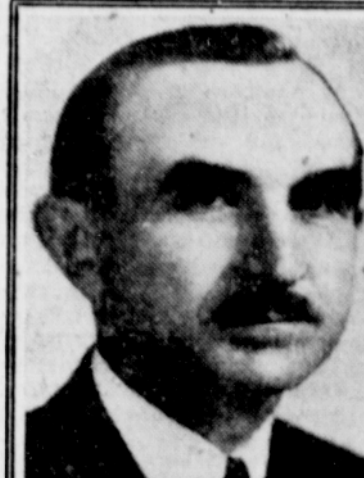
