Next Tuesday thousands of Oregon voters must decide whether or not state support of public schools will be established upon a permanent basis and made a part of the constitution of the state of Oregon. The matter is too important to the future of Oregon to be passed over lightly.

For decades Oregon was near the very bottom of the list of the 48 states in its support of public education. The burden, as worried home owners will attest, had to be borne almost exclusively by local property taxes. Then came a state income tax surplus and the teachers of Oregon successful in diverting a portion of the surplus to relieve the property owner of his unequal burden.

Now the teachers and school board members of Oregon propose, through the medium of a constitutional amendment, to make that relief permanent and to provide future educational opportunity for Oregon youth. Teachers and board members have demonstrated their good faith in tax matters. They have demonstrated their good faith in tax matters. They have demonstrated that state support does equalize the tax burden and provide for better education.

Best Broccoli

While broccoli will grow and bear all summer, the best quality is produced in the early summer and in the autumn. For an early crop, best results are obtained by setting out plants at the same time as cabbage plants. Seed may be sown in the garden as soon as the ground has been prepared, or if the fall harvest is preferred sowing may be delayed until May. It takes about 70 days before the edible heads begin to develop.

1,327,000 LOST TO ARMY

The war department reported yesterday at Washington that 1,327,000 men departed from the army through Aug. 31. Of these, 104,000 died in battle or otherwise, 1,000,000 were honorably discharged, 86,000 were listed as

prisoners or missing, and there were 167,000 "other separations." Other separations include army men placed on an inactive status and retirements of regular army personnel.

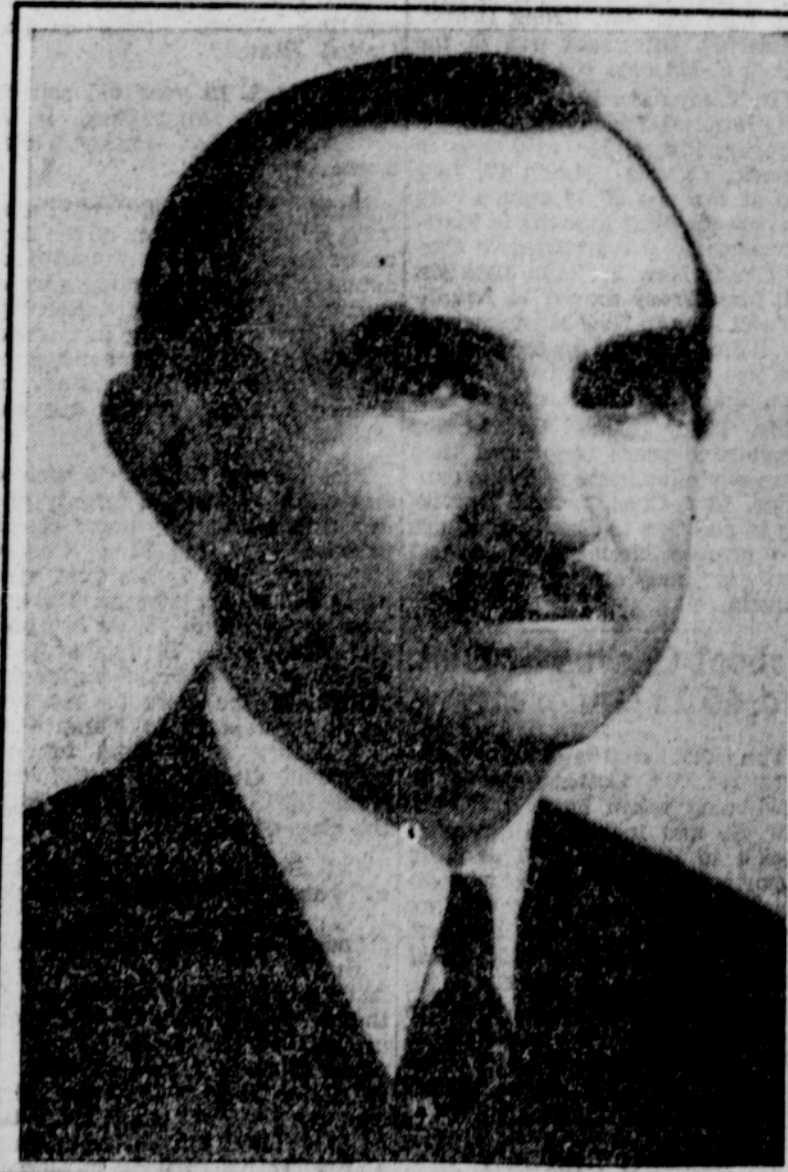
