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December 15th Is Income Date for Lane Co. Farmers

With December 15 the important annual income tax date for farmers, the county agent's office has obtained a supply of explanatory bulletins, for Lane County farmers desiring them, County Agent O. S. Fletcher announced today.

The bulletin, issued by the United States department of agriculture, is entitled "Farm Bookkeeping and the Federal Income Tax." It is a revision of a similar bulletin issued a year ago and brought up to date in line with the provisions of the 1944 tax law. While the individual income tax act of 1944 simplified some of the requirements, it did not materially affect the problem of determining the net profit from farm operations, Mr. Fletcher explains.

The bulletin explains the kinds of records that are needed for tax purposes, discusses returns made on both the cash and accrual basis, and shows how the various farm operations are to be reported for income tax purposes. For those farmers already keeping a regular set of books or farm accounts the filling out of a return will be relatively simple. For those who have not kept books, it still is not too late to gain some advantage by using a prepared account book to record the year's transactions from memory.

The farm management department of Oregon State College has prepared three kinds of account books, all of which are available at the county agent's office. These are a five-year inventory book, an Oregon cash farm record book, and the complete Oregon farm account book. For those who desire a simple book in which to record the year's business transactions in advance of making the income tax return, the Oregon cash farm account book is recommended by the county agent. Explanatory statements as to who will profit by making out joint rather than separate income tax returns are also available.

For actual aid in filling out returns, the bureau of internal revenue will have specialists available without cost, as usual, in the principal towns in advance of the final date.

BIG CRANBERRY CROP IN OREGON EASES SHORTAGE

Oregon has helped to offset the country's short crop of cranberries by producing what is expected to be a record crop of about 1,150,000 pounds of this traditional Thanksgiving delicacy, the O. S. C. Extension service has been informed.

Oregon's cranberries are produced almost exclusively in two

counties—Coos with around 150 acres and Clatsop with about 27 acres. Production is estimated to be approximately 40 per cent greater than last year.

Most of the Clatsop county crop was "scooped" with a special type of forked scoop, County Agent Don Jessy reported, thereby requiring fewer pickers.

Most of Oregon's cranberries go to the fresh market, some of them to the middle west, although a considerable tonnage is canned. Massachusetts and Wisconsin are the leading cranberry producers. The United States crop this year is estimated at just slightly over half that of
