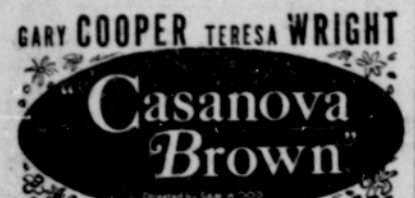

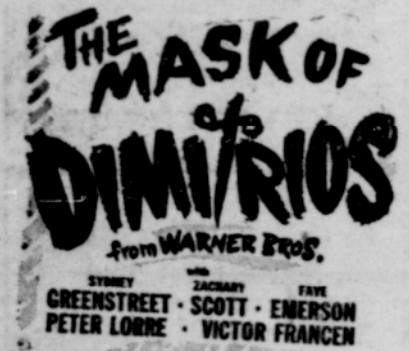

Methodists Join National Crusade

Methodists of Cottage Grove and vicinity are being called to take part in raising \$25,000,000 for world relief and reconstruction, the first phase of the denomination's nation-wide Crusade for Christ program of post-war service. The Methodist congregation here is part of nearly 8,000,000 members of 41,000 churches in the United States who are participating in the four year, five fold Crusade.

Expenditure of the Crusade fund by the regular, general agencies of the church will provide for "feeding the hungry, clothing the destitute, and freeing the minds and spirits of the ignorant, the underprivileged, the driven and the dispossessed," the Rev. Frank E. Brown said. Three-fifths of the fund has been allocated for the "rebuilding and rehabilitation of human life" in foreign countries, nine-tenths in war-devastated areas and the rest in other mission fields. The balance will be used for emergency, war-caused needs in this country.

Cooky and candy making

TIME TO start thinking about those holiday "goodies"! And here are two examples of how easy it is to turn those thoughts into delicious things-to-eat:

GINGERBREAD MEN
3 cups enriched flour 1/2 cup brown sugar firmly packed
3 tps. baking powder 1/2 cup dark molasses
1/2 tsp. salt 1 egg
1/2 tsp. ginger
1/2 cup shortening

Sift and measure flour; sift again with baking powder, salt, and ginger. Cream shortening and sugar until light and fluffy. Add molasses and unbeaten egg; beat well. Add flour mixture gradually, mixing well after each addition. Roll on slightly floured board to 1/4-inch thickness. Cut with floured gingerbread-man cutter or cut a large square for the body, smaller circle for the head, and strips for the arms and legs. Place on lightly greased cookie or baking sheet. Bake in moderate oven (350° F.) until done, 10 to 12 minutes. Remove cookies immediately to rack; cool; store. Makes about 4 doz. 2-inch cookies or 6 large 10-inch gingerbread men.

TURKISH DELIGHT
3 tbsps. unflavored gelatin 2 tbsps. lemon juice
1/2 cup cold water 1 tbsps. grated orange or lemon rind
2 cups sugar 8 drops yellow vegetable coloring
1/2 cup hot water
2 tbsps. orange juice

Soften gelatin in cold water. Combine sugar and hot water in saucepan and stir well until sugar is dissolved. Bring to boil; add softened gelatin and cook slowly for 20 minutes. Remove from heat and add orange and lemon juice, grated rind, and coloring. Pour to about 1-inch thickness into shallow pan (4x10) which has been rinsed with cold water. Let stand overnight; turn out on board lightly sprinkled with powdered sugar; cut in one-inch cubes and roll in powdered sugar. Makes about 40 cubes.
