New 100 Octane Standard Oil Gas Plant Operating

The new \$20,000,000 Defense Plant Corporation hundred octane gasoline plant operated by Standard of California was "on stream" at Richmond, California today. This new installation, with a capacity of several thousand barrels daily, makes Standard's Richmond refinery one of the world's largest producers of gasoline rating 100 octane or better. In terms of flying power, according to the War Department the new plant will turn out enough 100 Octane to fuel a "substantial force" of B-29 Super Fortresses daily for the round trip from Saipan to Tokyo.

Operations began last week with a brief noon ceremony at the plant, in which high officers of the Army, Navy and Marine Corps participated. The principal speaker was Major Joe Foss, famous Marine Corps ace. Others on the program were Rear Admiral Carlton Wright, USN, Commandant of the 12th Naval District, Major General Julian C. Smith, USMC, in command of the Marine Corps Pacific Department, Brigadier General Thomas O. Hardin, USA, commanding the Air Transport Command, and R. G. Follis, vice president of Standard. Construction was started several months ago and was rushed through to completion to provide fuel for climatic air blows against the enemy. While its gallantry becomes part of the nation's overall aviation gasoline supplies as a matter of geographical availability, it will be used primarily in the mounting air offensive against Japan. Direct access to tanker loading facilities gives the new plant high strategic value. In addition Refinery barrel loading facilities have been expanded so that a large portion of the output can be transported in easily handled metal drums. The central structure in the big new plant is the thermofor catalytic cracking and treating unit. The "cat cracker," which towers 238 feet into the air, is as high and as capacious as the average 22-story office building.
