

New Fiber Flax Variety Bred At O. S. C. Bests Others

A new variety of fiber flax with many superior characteristics compared with present standard sorts has been developed at the Oregon experiment station by E. G. Nelson, federal agronomist stationed there.

This new variety, named the Cascade has been released for field production to increase seed and is expected to be available in 1946 for planting part of Oregon's commercial acreage. With the release of this new variety a program of seed certification for fiber flax, first of its kind in the United States, will be undertaken by the O. S. C. Extension service, says Chet Otis, assistant specialist in farm crops.

Desirable characteristics found in the new variety are exceptionally high yield of straw and fiber, good percentage of fiber in straw—averaging 15.7 per cent in the past three years—immunity to rust, resistance to wilt and tall growth habit. Only undesirable characteristics apparent are lack of uniformity in height and somewhat late maturity.

Release of this new variety comes at a time when the flax industry in Oregon is seeking means by which to reduce production costs to meet expected postwar conditions extension officials point out. All indications so far are that this new variety is clearly superior to Riga, Concurrent, and Martin, varieties now most commonly used. Other new sorts are still under test, reports Nelson, some of which may later be released if they continue to give good results.

Under the plan for rapid increase of seed supplies of Cascade the entire 30 pounds released has been turned over to Washington County Flax Growers association, which has arranged to have its sown under conditions to produce the maximum seed yield this season. The Washington association will in turn release an equal amount of seed stock to all other processing plants this year.
