

Abbruzzi Rye to Be Widely Used For Cover Crops

Ample seed supplies for a greatly expanded use of abbruzzi rye in Oregon will be available this fall if plans of the farm crops department at O. S. C. succeed this season. While this is not a new rye variety, its valuable characteristics for use in this state for winter pasture and cover crop purposes were discovered in recent years, since then seed has been too scarce for general use.

Last year the farm crops department harvested seven acres of this rye, getting approximately 240 sacks of grain, of which all but 20 have been distributed to growers who have agreed to grow the crop for seed. The seed will be certified this summer and will be available for distribution for general use next fall.

The unusual value of this rye for Oregon purposes comes from the fact that it combines the growth habits of a spring rye with the hardiness of many winter varieties. When planted in the fall it does not go into a resting stage but, if well established, will grow all winter and be ready to reach maximum growth much earlier in the spring than any other cover crop now in use, explains Dr. D. D. Hill, head of the department.

This characteristic of the variety was discovered some years ago when Dr. Hill carried on varietal tests with many kinds of small grains at the central experiment station. There it exceeded any other grain for fall or winter growth, and has performed equally well on farms since then. While its use so far has been mostly west of the mountains, it has been tried successfully in parts of eastern Oregon as well.

As a cover crop abgruzzi rye has the further advantage of making a quick protective cover in the fall and then reaching maximum growth stage in the spring before it robs the soil of needed moisture, adds Chester Ott, assistant extension specialist in farm crops. It can be turned under around the first of April, adding to the soil a heavy tonnage of organic matter in succulent form easy for organisms to break down.
