This issue cannot be left to the politicians. It must be our concern, everyone of us.

VACATION POSSIBILITIES IN THE POST WAR

Vacation possibilities for all of western Oregon will be tremendous during the post war period, even if we discount fifty percent of what we hear and read. Likewise many people, who no longer pursue an active vocation would like to spend their reclining years in this section. The public will naturally seek that locality which offers them hospitality and remain where they are well treated.

If it is worth anything to count our assets this particular section should be one of the favored spots. And we are not one of those who believe the newcomer will spoil our fishing and our scenery. Heavy May Rains
Gives Opportunity
For Forage Crops

Unusually heavy May rainfall, which has been fairly general throughout the state, may have delayed the planting of some spring crops but it provides unusual opportunity for starting others, says Dr. D. D. Hill, head of the farm crops department at Oregon State college.

In some sections the length of the rainy period has delayed spring grain seeding beyond the desirable planting dates. Some of the acreage that would normally have gone into spring grain might well be diverted either to emergency or permanent forage crops, he says. In western Oregon, for example, the conditions will be ideal for seeding sudan grass as an emergency pasture crop, or a combination of alfalfa and subterranean clover for permanent pasture. Some farmers, says Dr. Hill, even combine the three of them, planning to pasture the sudan grass late this summer and at the same time "pasturing in" the alfalfa and subterranean clover.

In some areas the generous rainfall will make ideal conditions for seeding alfalfa. Weeds already started on land that has been plowed can now be eliminated and a firm seed bed worked down with the assurance of plenty of moisture to germinate the seed.

More extensive planting of field corn than was first planned might also be considered, says Dr. Hill. Soil and moisture conditions will

be favorable for prompt germination and a good start for a corn crop.

A further cropping possibility suggested is the planting of ladino clover on unirrigated land for a seed crop next year. At present and prospective prices ladino clover planted in rows and raised as a dry land crop offers good opportunity for profit, as a number of farmers have already demonstrated, he says.

WHY AND HOW OF COUGHING

Cough is a symptom of some irritating influence along the course of the vagus nerve or its branches. It represents Nature's effort to get rid of this irritation by spasmodic muscular contractions and other physiologic movements. Bacterial infection of the airways is such a common occurrence, and therefore cough is such a natural sequence, that we have come to discount it unless its presence becomes too disturbing and prevents our hearing what is going on around us. A curious phenomenon is the suppressed cough. During a prayer in church, or while an aria is being sung in an opera, the audience is so intent, as a rule, that there is almost complete silence. As soon as tension is relaxed at the end of the offering, coughs and throat scraping are heard from all quarters of the auditorium. In listening in on a radio program from a great hall, one is particularly impressed by this mass demonstration of human noises during a lull or interval in the proceedings.

All mucous membrane surfaces, even in health, must discharge secretions; that is part of their function. In the presence of disease, these secretions are greatly increased and must be gotten rid of as thoroughly and as promptly as possible. Drainage from the upper as well as from the lower airways is abundant through the mouth (secretion from the back of the nose is pulled back and expectorated or swallowed).
