**Harpole, Bauder Meet**

Although they fought within hailing distance of each other on Bataan, Pfc. Marvin Harpole and Pfc. Harold (Jake) Bauder, former football team mates of Cottage Grove high school, did not meet until recently. Pfc. Harpole, whose parents, Mr. and Mrs. W. M. Harpole, reside at 45 So. 12th St., is fighting with the 149th Infantry, 38th Division as an 81 mm mortar gunner. A Red Cross state registration book in a rest camp behind the lines gave the first clue to Harpole that his buddy was on Luzon. Until they finally met, the boys hadn't realized that they had been fighting side by side, when Pfc. Bauder's tank battalion was supporting the Infantry during the bloody battle for ZigZag Pass. Harpole told his buddy, Pfc. Bauder, "I was sure glad to see your tank outfit come up. We'd been fighting off Jap tanks with only bazookas and mortars for a week."

Two former residents, the Misses Hazel and Helen Wells now taking "boot" training at the U. S. Naval training school (WR)-Bronx, N. Y., were pictured in the news recently as they played music records in the recreation rooms of their station. The girls are the daughters of Mr. and Mrs. William Wells, former residents now living in Eugene, and both attended the local high school.

Pvt. Lester Blackmore, son of Mr. and Mrs. O. W. Blackmore, who enlisted in the armed forces in February, 1940, received an honorable discharge May 30 at Ft. Lewis and is now at his parental home in Cottage Grove. Lester spent 33 months on foreign duty and was in combat in north Africa, Tunisia and Italy. Pvt. Blackmore expressed happiness at being home once more.

Mrs. E. C. Grable of 306 South 1st street has received word from her son Eldon Grable AEM2/C of the navy that he had just returned from the Philippine Islands. He is an aerial gunner aboard a torpedo bomber and holds the presidential unit citation, the south Pacific war with seven stars, the ETO with one star, the Pre-Pearl Harbor bar with one star, the American theater of war bar and the combat gunner wings. He has served with the merchant marines, the cavalry and the navy. Prior to enlisting in the navy he was an electric engineer with the army air corps in California.

Asbury is in a firing battery of the 51st Field Artillery battalion of the 6th Infantry Division for the continuous combat record for the Pacific theater. The 6th participated in the Maffin Bay and Sansapor, New Guinea campaigns before coming to Luzon.
