Zeppelin Center

Friedrichshafen rose to world significance in the early years of the present century as the headquarters of the Zeppelin industries, later to extend their activities to other German cities. As the designs of the airships were improved, the original floating sheds housing the craft on the lake were replaced with substantial shore shelters fringed with foundries, machine shops, fabricating plants, and office buildings. As airplanes became competitive, these craft, too, were manufactured at the Zeppelin industrial plants. Lake Constance proved an excellent testing space for the big Zeppelin-Dornier flying boats.

Utilize Waste

Due to necessity, foreign countries have been converting wood fiber into alcohol, protein feeds, and other products, even including clothing for their families for nearly 20 years. Although our scientists have for years been exploring the possibilities of using wood waste, America has been slow in putting the results of their research to practical use. We have always had such a plentiful supply of raw materials that we have not really worried seriously about using our forests for anything more than a source of lumber, paper and fuel.

Reinterred Doughboys

No American soldier who died fighting abroad in World War I was left to lie on foreign soil except at the express wish of his next-of-kin. While this guarantee was made to only one American battalion in World War I, according to Encyclopedia Britannica, it was the primary reason the United States government undertook the tremendous project of transporting 50,000 American dead back across the Atlantic. More than 30,000 American soldiers who died in service in that war still remain buried in France, Belgium and England.

Colored Roots

Roosevelt's Appeal for 7th War Loan

WASHINGTON, D. C.—Before his death President Franklin D. Roosevelt issued a statement in support of the Mighty Seventh War Loan for 14 billions of dollars in which he reminds the Nation it is still locked in a deadly struggle with its enemies. The President stressed the importance of greater production together with the buying and holding of War Bonds to help achieve the victory. He said: "I don't need to tell you that we are still locked in a deadly struggle with our enemies—the enemies of our way of life—and the war is still the chief job of each one of us. The greatest production of which we are capable, faithful adherence to regulations that make it possible to supply our boys in battle with everything they need, and buying and holding War Bonds—these are things we at home must do to speed victory."

"In the past three years more than 85 millions of Americans have invested billions of dollars in bonds. Never before have so many people held such a direct share in a great national effort. To save—to buy and to hold all we can for war bonds—this is a small service to ask of us who do not fight—yet it is one of the biggest things we can do for our fighting men."

Moth Preventive

To discourage moths and carpet beetles, use the moth spray, flakes or balls generously, but avoid putting the flakes or balls directly on the woollens, as they have been known to fade garments. Since fumes from the flakes or balls go downward, the best place for them is on a high shelf, or in a cloth sack hung from a high hook on the ceiling. Woolen clothing placed in sealed or closed garment bags can then be hung in the closet.

Straighten Hem

Straighten the hem of your own dress without a hem marker. Put your dress on, stand by a table, using edge as a guide to pin a line around the hips. With a yardstick measure from pins to floor, then subtract distance from floor to desired length as figured above. Turn and press hem and trim an even hem allowance. Turn edge under and machine stitch fold of bulky material. Inconspicuously hand stitch edge in place.

Big Business

Four sugar refining companies produce 79 per cent of the sugar; 4 glass companies produce 88 per cent of the glass. 4 farm machinery manufacturers produce 85 per cent of our farm machinery; 64 per cent of the nation's iron and steel is produced by 8 companies; all of our linoleum comes from the plants of 4 companies; more than 90 per cent of our aluminum is produced by 1 company. But, 38,820 sawmills produce 80 per cent of the lumber.

Core of Joshua Tree Hollow
