Presbyterians to Observe Ninetieth Birthday Sunday

tors and members of the church.

The anniversary celebration will close with a communion service on Sunday, July 8th at the eleven o'clock service. It is hoped that at that service we will be able to announce that the half way mark has been reached on our building fund campaign, namely \$25,000.00. This oldest church of the community is looking forward toward a new church building and educational plant that will cost in the neighborhood of \$50,000.00 to be erected as soon as the necessary funds are raised.

This organization that is now the Presbyterian church had its inception on the first Sunday in July, 1855, which was the first day of the month. The first Sunday of July this year is also the first of the month, so that the celebration will be on the exact date of the anniversary.

Following is a copy of the document signed by those hardy pioneers and God-fearing men and women who 90 years ago felt the need of a permanent religious body and organized the first church of any kind in this section of Oregon, an organization which lives today in the present Presbyterian church:

"The undersigned professing the religion of Jesus Christ, being assembled in the school house near John Currin's the first sabbath in July, 1855, in Lane county, Oregon, in the bounds of the Oregon Presbytery of the C. P. Church and believing the doctrines and governments of the said church are based upon and in accordance of the Word of God and being willing to support the gospel as God may bless and prosper us, we agree to associate together as a church to be called 'The Coast Fork Congregation of the Cumberland Presbyterian Church' and ask the said Presbytery to take us under its care."

A group held services before the date of the formal organization of the church and this group formed the nucleus for the organized church and were the inspiration for its being.

The following were listed as charter members: William Oglesby, L. Buoy, H. C. Veatch, Mary Oglesby, Jane Buoy, Perrin Bryson, Samuel Dillard, Elizabeth Dillard, John Currin, Margaret Currin, William W. Oglesby, Mary Oglesby, Letitia Cochran, George Small, Elizabeth H. Kelly, J. J. Vandervest, John Cochran, Mary Swift, Martha Anderson, Grace Vandervest, Sara Ann Bryant, Elizabeth Ensley.

Not one of the charter members is now living. However two daughters of charter members are still active in the church namely Mrs. Eva Holderman and Mrs. J. P. Graham, who will read a short history of the church at the Sunday evening service.

William Oglesby, the grandfather of Mrs. Graham and Laban Buoy were elected as elders of the baby church, while H. C. Veatch, the father of Mrs. Eva Holderman and Oliver Veatch was chosen as ruling elder.

The school house at Latham was used for some time as the place to hold services. For a number of years they met in various schools throughout the community, until the need for a permanent home caused the workers to lay plans for a building in the village of Cottage Grove.

In 1871 the church was responsible for the organization of a lodge of Good Templars. On May 24, 1873, the church and the Templars purchased from R. H. Hazelton a plot of ground on what is now Main street, where stands part of the Methodist church, the Awrey building and the I. O. O. F. building.

A two story building was erected, the upper floor being used for the Good Templars and the lower floor for religious services. This building was later used by two other denominations. The Presbyterians held their services twice a month and the Church of Christ and the Methodist alternated on the other Sundays.

While the young church had a number of fine pastors for stated supply the Reverend William V. McGee was the first regularly installed pastor. He came direct from college in Lebanon, Tenn., arriving on July 25, 1888. Rev. McGee is now living in Cottage Grove and is still active in the church.

On February 10, 1892 the Presbyterians moved into their new church at the corner of Seventh and Adams streets, where it yet stands. Pastor McGee was largely the inspiration in this work, al-

though he left before it was completed. The Methodist people bought the former property of the Presbyterians and have since added to the original structure.

It is of interest to note that members have been received from almost every state in the union. Many of the letters are yellow with age but testify to the fidelity of the pioneer who, when he left his home, did not leave his church.

On January 3, 1906, the Cumberland Presbyterian church transferred its property to the Presbyterian Church U.S.A. and as such it exists to this day, now known as the First Presbyterian of Cottage Grove.

Rev. Alvin J. Kammann, the present pastor, has been here a little over a year. The church now is promoting a Building Fund for \$50,000. They are in hopes of reaching the half-way mark by the time they close their ninety-ninth anniversary celebration with a communion service on July 8th. All the people of Cottage Grove are cordially invited to any or all of the services.
