POSTWAR HIGHWAY PROGRAM BENEFITS SCHOOLS

Rural education will receive a great impetus from the post-war highway construction program, Charles M. Upham, engineer-director of the American Road Builders' association, told a conference of educators at Washington recently.

"The little red school house is all right in tradition, but it has its drawbacks. Having to trudge daily through mud, dust or snow to reach it, impaired its value," Mr. Upham said.

"America has 2,400,000 miles of rural roads serving 6,000,000 farms, but only 45,000 miles have a high type pavement and 99,000 miles have a low-type bituminous surfacing."

A seed yield of 250 pounds per acre followed.
