Early Fumigation Of Hairy Vetch Seed Is Advised

The heavy infestation of hairy vetch weevil in seed this season is likely to cause severe losses to hairy vetch growers, according to O. S. Fletcher, county agent. No effective control is available this year so much Lane county seed is infested with the weevil.

Early fumigation kills the weevil in the seed. These seeds weigh about the same as unfested seed and ordinarily are not removed by the cleaning process. Later fumigation allows the weevil to approach maturity or mature and leave the seed so that the seed is reduced in weight. Light weight seed can be removed by the cleaning process, thus improving the germination of the seed lot. Apparently there is not much difference in the effect on the germination of the individual seed whether the fumigation is done immediately after harvest or delayed a couple of months.

The county agent states that in most cases farmers should realize more from weevily seed if fumigation and recleaning is delayed until October 1st. Where this is done, the percentage of germination of many lots of seed can be raised so that the net amount paid the farmer for the seed will be greater than where the seed is cleaned and fumigated immediately after harvest.

Second Home on 10th Street Is Purchased

The Richard Jay Davis family is the second Cottage Grove family who has purchased a home with the assistance of the GI bill of rights, according to Theodore O. Erickson, president of the Northwest Homes, Inc., who announced the sale. The first family to use this method of purchasing a home in Cottage Grove was that of Robert L. Wegand who purchased his home last week, Mr. Erickson said.

According to Mr. Erickson, the houses each have two bedrooms, are finished with hardwood floors and are equipped with automatic electric hot water heaters.

Under the provisions of the GI bill of rights, no down payment is required from qualified veterans in the purchase of these houses and the monthly payments including taxes, insurance, principal and interest will amount to about \$36.56 per month.

Both the new Davis and Wegand homes are located on Taylor street between 10th and 11th across the street from the high school in Cottage Grove.

The reason that these homes can be purchased with GI home loans is because they are priced for sale at an amount that the Veterans Administration has established as a reasonable normal value.

Mr. Erickson said that there are five more homes available in his project that his company privately built and privately financed and that he will be on the premises Sunday, August 26, from 10 a. m. to 5 p. m.

D. P. Potter Moving Sawmill on His Ranch East of Cottage Grove

D. P. Potter said yesterday he planned to move a small sawmill on his ranch east of town and would have the mill in operation within the next thirty days. His son, Howard Potter formerly of Dallas will run the plant, which will produce squared timber. The mill will have a capacity of 15,000 feet daily and will employ eight or ten men. It will be powered by a 150 horsepower diesel engine.

LAWN WEED CONTROL BY CHEMICALS EXPLAINED

How to rid lawns of weeds by use of chemicals that kill weeds without harming the grass permanently is described in a new OSC experiment station circular of information No. 366, which is a revision of an earlier circular on the same subject.

The three materials recommend-

ed under various conditions are Sinox, oil sprays, and arsenite solution. The circular includes no information on the new hormone weed killers which are now undergoing tests at the station. The circular, obtainable free from any extension office, gives detailed directions for applying the chemicals.
