Enlistments Now Accepted for Marines

The Marine Corps recruiting office in Portland has announced that enlistments are now being accepted in the regular Marines for either a three-year or a four-year period. Prior to this time, only four-year enlistments have been offered.

The minimum height requirement has also been lowered to 63 inches, for men who are between the ages of 17 and 19. So long as the Selective Service Act remains in effect, the consent of parents will be required from 17-year-olds.

Enlistments in the Marine Corps are open to men between the ages of 17 and 25 who have had no previous military service, and to veterans between 17 and 32 who reenlist within one year of their discharge. Veterans who sign up within 90 days of their discharge will retain their former rank and date of rank and if they reenlist before the end of the 90-day period, the remainder of that time will be granted as a reenlistment furlough.
