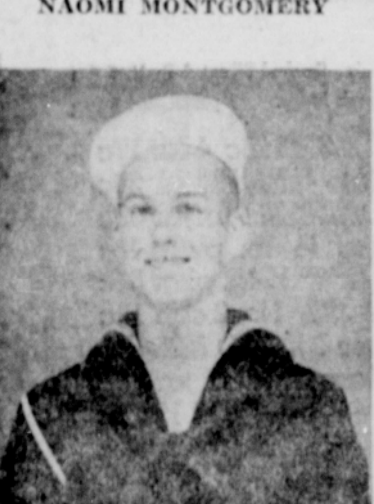

Removing Grass Stains
Use ordinary unsalted lard to remove grass stains. If the stain is old or is a persistent one, mix the lard with kerosene, turpentine or glycerine. "Float" out the stain by rubbing a small amount of fat on the spot and working it about with the finger until stain is worked into the fat. Let stand about an hour and then wash in warm (not hot) water.

Appetite Guides Needs
For the average person there is no great problem in knowing how much to eat—since appetite usually guides one in eating the right number of calories. When anyone eats too many calories, be he child or adult, the calories are stored in the body primarily as fat. Thus overeating is the main cause of obesity.

Oriental Poppy
The oriental poppy (Papaver orientale) is perhaps the most popular of the poppies—with large flowers from 6 to 12 inches across. They follow the iris into bloom, are very hardy perennials and apparently have no important diseases or insect pests. They grow well in almost any soil but demand full sun for profuse blooming.

The Cottage Grove freshmen-sophomore team defeated the Junction City freshman-sophomore team 13-0 here last Thursday afternoon.

The scrappy Lions started the last quarter with a drive that took them to the Junction 35-yard line where Wally Morelock, Lion quarterback, broke the ice with a pass to Spud Campbell into the end zone. Bob Summers, fullback, went around right end for the conversion. The Lions held the Tigers for four downs and took over on their own 30. After making thirteen yards by hitting the line, Spud Campbell broke through left tackle for a sensational run of 60 yards and a touchdown. The try for extra point was stopped. The few remaining minutes were played in mid-field.

Lions to Meet Sweethome

Coach Bob Dusenberry's Cottage Grove Lions are favored to win when they meet the Sweet Home eleven on the Lion's home field next Friday evening at 8:00 p. m.

The Lions, who haven't tasted defeat in 10 starts, two this season, will be out for blood when they go gunning for their eleventh straight victory. Most of the team will be in top shape after two weeks of rest although several of the first string players have been nursing injuries received in the two previous games. "Cork" Ewing is still bothered by the leg injury he received in preseason scrimmage but it is expected that he will be able to start against the Sweet Home invaders.

In the past two weeks Coach Dusenberry has been drilling his charges on blocking and tackling. He has also made some changes in the starting lineup. Harlan Chapman has been shifted to left end and reserve halfback "Spud" Campbell has been given a first string berth at right half. This change strengthens the defensive line play and does not weaken the backfield.

The Lions pass defense, weak in the Reedsport game, was improved greatly in the Junction City game. The Tigers failed to complete a pass in four attempts. The Sweet Home griders are also undefeated this season after nosing out Uni Hi 13 to 12 and battling Lebanon to a scoreless tie.

The Lions "B" squad will play their second game of the season against the Uni Hi "B" squad Thursday night.

This will be a new experience for the "B" squaders since very few of them have played under the lights.

The game will be played at Kelly Field at 8 p. m. There is no admission charge so come to the game.
