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How to make hearty soups for winter energy
A steaming bowl of hearty soup is a short cut to energy during these days when Jack Frost holds sway. With winter produce as a base you can create an appetizing repertoire of delicious soups to satisfy the most exacting palate. Build your menu around any of the recipes listed below - and don't be surprised when the winter family calls for second helpings.

CHILET AND POTATO CHOWDER
1 small dry onion, 1 tsp. salt
finely chopped 1/4 tsp. paprika
4 tbsp. butter or margarine, diced and cooked
2 cups sliced onion 2 cups sliced potato
2 cups sliced carrot 2 cups sliced celery
2 cups boiling water 1 tsp. sugar
water

LENTILS ON BEAN SOUP
8 slices bacon or salt pork, diced 1 dash of cayenne
1 cup sliced onion 1/2 tsp. salt
1/2 cup sliced celery 2 cups flour
1 cup lentils or beans 1 hard-boiled egg
1/2 tsp. salt 1 lemon, sliced
1/2 tsp. dry mustard 1 cup cold water

Crisp bacon or salt pork; add onion and celery; saute until lightly browned. Add lentils or beans, which have been washed; add water, cover; simmer 3 hours, or until beans are soft, adding more water as needed. Rub through sieve, reheat; add well mixed seasonings. Melt shortening; stir in flour and strained soup mixture gradually; cook 3 minutes, stirring constantly, until smooth and thickened. Turn into serving dishes; garnish with thin slices of hard-boiled egg and lemon. Serves 4.
