The waste fats saved in Lane county kitchens come right back home helping to supply soap, shoes, tires, cotton sheets and hundreds of other items, according to Ernest E. Schrenk, chairman of the county AAA committee.

Oregon collections of used fats last month amounted to 172,369 pounds—a 3 percent increase over September, according to a report received by the county AAA chairman from the Oregon field service branch of the Production and Marketing Administration.

Secretary of Agriculture Clinton Anderson states that there is still urgent need for more used fats, even though meat is no longer rationed.

The salvaging and turning in of every drop of used fats to retail meat dealers means the return of plentiful supplies of household articles, and since fats are used in the manufacture of numerous other things we all want—nylon stockings and electric appliances—the used fats that county housewives skim, scoop and scrape can help bring larger quantities of these items back sooner.

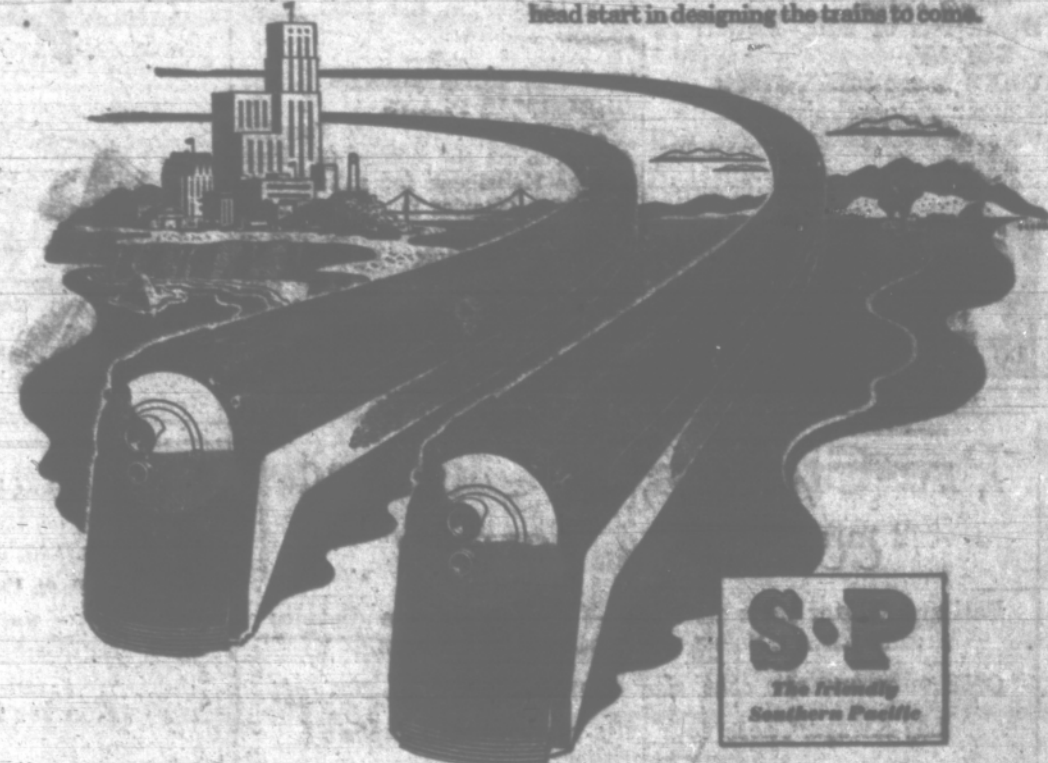
