Lions Defeated

came when the Dragons set Neideigh back for a loss of 26 yards ending a dangerous scoring threat, but the Lions were game and Noel Campbell picked up six; Neideigh sprinted 15 more to just miss making a first down. After making two first downs by rushing, the Dragons again took to the air, but again their pass was intercepted by Virgil Newton on the Dragons' 45 and returned to the 40. Chapman made a first down on the 28. Newton made a penalty on Hood River set the ball on the 15. Campbell hit the line for two. Neideigh was put out of the game with a sprained wrist on the play. On the next play the Lions fumbled with Hood River recovering. With but a few minutes to play in the first half the Dragons completed two passes and a 15-yard run down to the Lion 24. Campbell intercepted another pass by O'Leary on the 10 and returned it to the 22 for the play which ended the first half.

Cottage Grove received the second half kickoff and after 3 attempts at a first down were forced to punt. The Dragons picked up 15 yards and decided to pass again. O'Leary who was getting the habit of passing to the Lions instead of the Dragons again passed the pigskin to a waiting Lion player, Paul Reeves. The Lions failed to knock off a first down and were forced to kick. O'Leary received the kick on the 45 and returned it to the Lions 33. An offside penalty and a 6-yard gain, put the ball on the Lions' 20 yard line. From here O'Leary managed to hit the Dragon substitute left half on the nine. From here he again passed and completed it to the Dragon left end in the end zone. O'Leary dropped the pigskin between the uprights for the conversion.

The fourth quarter was fought in mid-field by two fairly weary teams. The Lions fought their way down to the Hood River 38 but were stopped on downs. The Dragons carried the ball back to the Lions' 15 when the final quarter ended.

TAHKENITCH LAKE SUIT FOR DAMAGES DISMISSED

PORTLAND — Federal Judge McCulloch has dismissed the \$160,000 damage suit brought against Crown-Zellerbach corporation by H. W. and U. Z. Fowler, Tahkenitch Lake resort owners.

The jury was stalemated on the case. The Fowlers, who charged logging operations had destroyed recreational facilities, are expected to file another suit unless there is an out-of-court settlement.
