

LET'S DON'T DEVELOP A LUXURY WE CAN'T AFFORD

This week a lady came into our office pretty well wrought up over the fact that so far the business people or merchants here apparently have taken little or no interest in maintaining the rest room at the city hall. She thought it was expensive for the rural people to have to furnish the room and then take time off to supervise it. We agreed with her, more particularly if she sets any value on her time and effort. While we hold no brief for the business man or merchant, we rather think that the negligence, if it might be called that is due to the fact that the average merchant does not know the problems connected with the operation of the waiting room, nor has he understood how the project is supposed to operate. If he did, we feel sure that the project would have his support.

From what we know of the waiting room, we think the manner of its operation is more or less of in the experimental stage and once the "bugs" are worked out of it, all the assistance necessary will be forthcoming.

Personally we can't see why the services of a full time supervisor is necessary, whether the supervisor donates her time or is paid for it, to keep the building in order. We can't feature some rural mother coming into the rest room and marking or defacing the walls or paint or wood work of the room or permitting her children to do so. Some supervision might be necessary, but this could be done by the building caretaker, even though it might be necessary to boost his salary a bit. We have suggested that such an arrangement might be worked out with the city or building owner, if the location is changed.

We have been interested in a project of this sort for some time and have made some inquiries as to how such a place might be operated.

We have not heard of a community successfully operating a project of this kind on a full time supervisor. Under the present wage scale, it's a luxury we could not afford.
