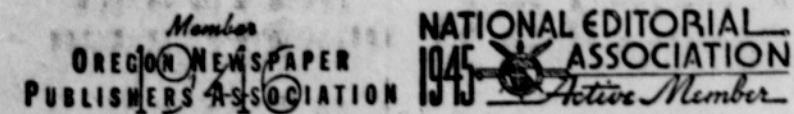

There will be no meeting of the young people Sunday evening, but an Easter cantata will be presented at 8:00 o'clock.

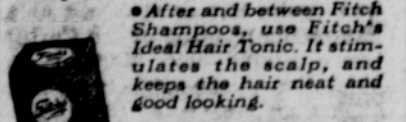

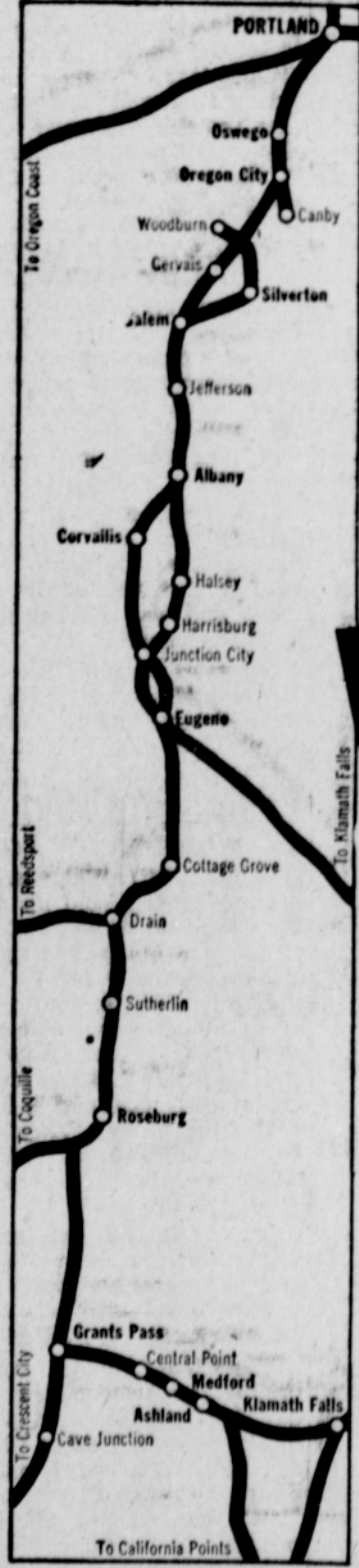
