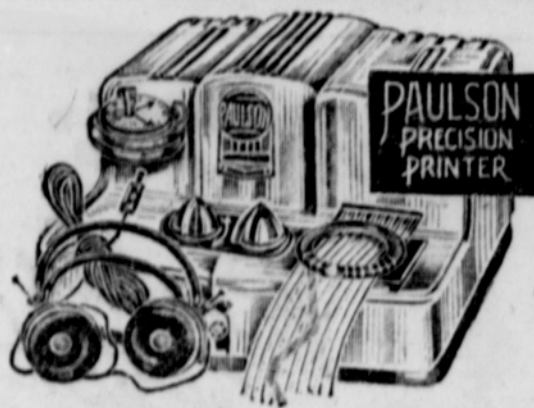

Ralph Allen Chosen As Delegate to Ohio Church Conference

Ralph Allen has been elected by the Official Board of the First Methodist church of Cottage Grove to be a delegate to the Bishops' conference with returned veterans to be held in Columbus, Ohio, July 4-7. Sponsored by the Council of Bishops of the Methodist Church, the conference will bring together a thousand young veterans from all parts of the nation for three days of discussion with the bishops. The purpose of the meeting is to clarify the relation of the church to veterans, the contributions veterans can make and the ways the church can continue the reintegration of returning servicemen.

The Cottage Grove Methodist church was notified a few days ago that it had been designated by Bishop Baxter of this area to send one delegate. Only 1000 of the 42,000 Methodist churches in the country are being given this privilege.
