Colonial Dish
Succotash is an early colonial vegetable dish composed of a mixture of green corn cut from the cob and shelled lima or other beans. If shelled beans or lima beans are not available, snap beans may be substituted. Cook until done and season with salt, pepper, butter and a little sweet milk. If to be canned, season only with salt and can in glass jars or C-enamel lined tin cans. Process at 10 pounds pressure in pressure canner just as for corn. In colonial days chicken or other meats were often added.

Peach and Prune Borers Damage Lane County Crops

The peach and prune root borer, which is prevalent in many peach and prune orchards in Lane county, is probably responsible for more damage to peach and prune trees than any other insect pest, says W. B. Parker, assistant county agent.

Experimentation has shown that this pest can be effectively and cheaply controlled by the use of paradi-chlorobenzene. The small crystals of this chemical, when applied in a ring about the base of the infested tree, and when exposed to a soil temperature of 60°F or above, changes to a gas which penetrates the burrows of the borers.

Growers are advised to examine their trees for the presence of borers during August, and early September. The usual sign of infestation is an accumulation of reddish, gummy sawdust at the base of the tree. This is the result of larval or "borer" feeding. The young larvae feed for a time in the outer layers of bark and, as they grow older burrow deeper into the bark, forming comparatively larger cavities in the inner bark and cambium which constitute the characteristic injury chiefly of the crown and roots.

Experience has shown that the best time to apply control measures is from now until September 15. When applying paradi-chlorobenzene to the trees keep the following points in mind: (1) Level off the surface of the soil about the base of the tree, clearing away all refuse. However, do not disturb the soil below the surface. Remove the large masses of gum present at the base of the tree. (2) Apply in a continuous ring around the base of the tree 1 inch wide and 2 inches from the trunk. (3) Then cover the ring with several shovelfuls of loose earth 3 inches deep.

Parker states that there are precautions that should be adhered to depending upon the age of the tree. Three-fourths to one ounce should be used for trees six years of age or over; use not over three-fourths of an ounce for trees four to five years old; use one-half ounce for trees one to three years old only if the life of the tree is definitely threatened by borers. Be sure this exact amount is used because more paradi-chlorobenzene may injure the tree. The amount of earth may be removed four to six weeks after application.

Try to save your fruit and your trees for at the present time we cannot afford to lose precious high-priced fruit that is needed for us and those elsewhere.

RETURN OF WHITE BREAD IS ORDERED

WASHINGTON—White bread and flour will replace the famine emergency's "dark" variety in the nation's bakeries and grocery stores within two or three weeks.

And brewers and distillers will be allowed to increase their production Sept. 1.

The changes will result from relaxations of government restrictions imposed on the use of grains last winter to make more American cereals available to the hungry abroad.

Beginning Sept. 1 millers will be allowed to discontinue the manufacture of "dark" flour, Secretary of Agriculture Anderson announced Thursday.
