World Seal Studied By U. N. Assembly

FLUSHING MEADOWS, New York—The United Nations may soon have an official emblem and seal.

Although U. N. has been using the now familiar design—a map of the world as seen from the North Pole, surrounded by crossed olive branches—since the San Francisco Conference in 1945, the emblem has not been approved officially by the General Assembly. It was originally designed by the United States Government for the identification button used at San Francisco.

The Assembly, now meeting here, will consider the problem of an official emblem and seal. It is, of course, free to select any design.
