Here's a recipe for making a popular cake without sugar, which is reprinted by request: 2 pkgs. pudding—any flavor 1/2 cup shortening, mix well Add 2 unbeaten eggs, one at a time Sift 1 1/2 cups flour, 2 teaspoons baking powder, 1/4 tsp salt. Mix alternately with one cup milk. Bake 25 minutes at 350 deg. Makes two layers.

JIMMY WALKER DIES

James J. Walker, 65, flamboyant, fabulous mayor of New York during the prohibition era, died at 6:25 Monday night at New York Doctors' Hospital where he had been taken Sunday after a blood clot formed on his brain.

The dapper, witty Jimmy died without regaining consciousness. He had been in a coma since mid-morning Sunday and was unable to receive the message of cheer from hundreds of friends in political, theatrical and business life.
